

#### **Notes on Hebrews:**

- 1. Author is unknown; written before A.D. 70
- 2. Written to an audience of Christian Jews or Gentiles, most likely the first
- 3. Hebrews contains 35 OT references, including repeated quotations
- 4. Provides teaching on the superiority of the Son, on faithfulness, and on practical lessons for living in this world

#### Hebrews 2:1-4

- 1. Warning to be attentive
- 2. Listen to the message
- 3. The danger of neglect

#### Hebrews 2:5-9

- 1. Not to the angels, but to humankind
- 2. Psalm 8:4-6 testify to be taken seriously
- 3. Man son of man quality

## Hebrews 2:10-18

- 1. The road to glory
- 2. Through suffering
- 3. Of the same family
- 4. Destroyer of death
- 5. Make atonement for the sins of the people

A Christian mission with a heart for Af(rica)'s peoples, with roots in a small band of faithful people who, in 1895, ventured inland to reach untouched by the gospel. Their vision set the course for over 120 years, as a community called and sent to live and minister among Af(rica)'s least-reached peoples.

St. John's has been supporting Tom & Megan since 2007. They serve on an island with a small team of fellow missionaries, involved in daily evangelism and discipleship.
