pastor's letter

On Memorial Day weekend, I had the opportunity to preach on how our faith shapes our work. My sermon largely focused on evangelism, which is sharing our faith with nonbelievers. My encouragement to you was to think of one aspect of your faith that brought you joy, and to think about how you could share that with someone else.

I recently spoke with one of my farmer friends, and he shared with me that he's surrounded by a lot of anxious farmers, as the wet weather continues on, making for a later and later start date. The latest start date some farmers can recall in their working years. And yet, my friend is calm. He wasn't calm last year, when his planting didn't really start until May 25. But he saw how God provided, and his trust in God's provision has grown. Now, he isn't worried. Evangelism for him might be offering nonbelieving farmers the "peace that passes understanding" that comes from trusting in a good God who cares for us. (And he might need to encourage Christian farmers with these same words!)

What are you thankful for? God's peace? God's forgiveness? God's love? God's guidance? God's faithful presence? How can you share this with someone else this week?

Another one of my friends is an evangelist at heart. He loves to ask people this question: "Who is Jesus to you?" Recently, one Indian gas station attendant described Jesus as a man with two wives, whom he had to work for seven years each. My friend saw that this man was confused. He was describing not Jesus, but Jacob, who worked 14 years for his wives Leah and Rachel. Some simply have not yet heard about Jesus!

Think about using my friend's question ("Who is Jesus to you?") as a way to start a spiritual conversation with others (or "what do you believe?"). Other questions that might pave the way to important, meaningful, spiritual conversations could include: "How was your weekend?" After hearing about your coworker's weekend, likely they'll ask about yours as well. Share about your weekend, but also share about your Sunday. Tell them about going to church, and what you learned, or what you value about your church, or what your faith means to you.

Another question that can bear fruit in another's life is this: "How can I pray for you?" Few people, even non-religious people, decline offers of prayer. Offering to pray for someone gives you a chance to listen to something that is burdening them and gives you a chance to show your care for them and to help them bear that burden just a bit by your prayer. One person shared the testimony that when they offered to pray for a nonbeliever going through a financial test, God soon answered his prayer. That person then asked if he could attend church with the young man who prayed for him. He wanted to learn more about the God who answered prayer! Maybe your care for others and prayer for them will also open the door for them to believe in the power and love of God! I'm praying God will grant you opportunities for sharing your faith, and the courage needed to actually share your faith with others.



Highlights of the May 20 Consistory

- a. Capital Campaign Committee Matt Gilroy (Executive Director of the Fulton County Economic Development Corporation) will present to the CCC about fundraising at their next meeting. Brad Roth is willing to be the EGR representative to update reports as he has done before.
- b. **Discernment Team** They are wrapping up fellowship this week, a printed report of goals that have been set will be available in June or July for Consistory.
- c. Evangelism Committee Judy Sears Looking into a possible Farm Day for next year, working on Book Bag Bash. Poster Contest went well, 21 posters were submitted.
- d. Facility Committee Jeff Rutledge 1st meeting was May 1st. A document put together in 2014 has been helpful to read through. Another meeting scheduled for May 29th. Routine monthly meetings are set up for the Wednesday before Consistory. Still looking for another member for the group.
- e. **Fellowship Committee** Brad Roth Hosting a Senior Breakfast on May 26th; Chicken BBQ with the EA Convocation in September.
- f. Mission Committee Only disbursements for May were \$6,000 in college scholarships. Eleven students applied. Darby Stevens received the Springer Scholarship of \$1000, Leah Hall was awarded the nursing scholarship for \$600. Nine other student received \$600 each. The committee is setting up contacts with some additional five county mission agencies.
- g. **Personnel Committee** Carrie Wooley/Laura Johnson
 - a. Custodial We have been unable to find someone for the second part-time custodial position. Received a bid from Advance Cleaning Contractors, quoted for Monday, Wednesday and Friday schedule, including cleaning supplies and equipment, quote came in at \$1,350 per month. Plan is to continue with Dean Buckenmeyer for 12.5 hours per week and have Advance provide for 15 hours of cleaning per week.
 - b. Summer Employment Proposal Darby Stevens began some work on historical files

- a few years ago, and Katie Wyse has inquired about work for the summer. She would be under direct supervision of Pastor Erich. She would be organizing historical files, preschool records, sorting and scanning photos, assisting with organizing preschool storage areas, and possible data entry of new office software. Approval was given to have Katie Wyse work over the summer for up to 12 weeks, up to 40 hours per week, at \$11 per hour.
- c. Salary and Housing Allowance for Pastors
 Personnel committee is looking for guidance
 on salary and housing allowance in consulting
 with the pastoral staff as to what percentage they
 would like listed as salary and what percentage
 as housing. Personnel committee to investigate
 with a tax consultant on the best tax advantage for
 salary and housing.
- d. Doctor of Ministry Proposal Pastor Alex is pursuing further education. Purpose is to continue to grow as a pastor, while enriching his faith in ministry. Classes are one week long, twice per year in St. Louis. One week in the summer, one week in the winter. Scholarships are available, the school will match what the church contributes up to 30%. Motion to table this discussion to next month was approved.
- h. Property Committee Scott Short Bell tower is painted and complete. One problem is the carillon speakers are not functioning currently as something was dropped on them. Basement sump pump quit working, which has now been fixed. First Energy/ Toledo Edison, will be clearing tree limbs along transmission lines by helicopter. Scott Short is resigning from cleaning the snow off the church's parking lot. There will be a need to have someone clear the snow for this coming winter. Thank you, Scott, for the years you've done this!
- i. **Spiritual Council** Erich Christman Discussion about leadership development, trying to get a head start on nominations for the fall. Spent time discussing worship. New monitors were purchased for up front. Issues with feedback were discovered, and now a purchase must be made for hand held microphones.
- j. **Pastor's Report** Erich Christman a. Accounting System Review – a good group working on this. Many questions have been raised, to which the group is seeking professional assistance with.

- b. EA Convocation Brochure must be done by the end of May. In June we will begin to see lists seeking volunteers to help with hospitality and meals.
- c. Help Build Hope Creating partnerships, Pastor Erich represented Habitat for Humanity (HFH) and SJCC at a weekend build. Crossroad Mission's Help Build Hope program would like SJCC to become a partner. This would be a blessing to HFH and also the family that will be living in that home that is built.
- d. Pastoral Discernment & Planning Time Pastor Erich is requesting a time of discernment for two weeks in July. Approval given.
- k. Associate Pastor's Report Alex Young
 a. Stephen Ministry getting ready to
 commission the trainees. Also working on
 recruiting to be care receivers. A few people
 interested as well. Looking for two new
 Stephen leaders. Betsy Redd will supervise
 current ministers, Alex will be taking
 responsibility for referrals and matching. We
 could function as is, but more help is needed.
 A schedule has been drafted to begin a second
 round of training at the end of October.
 - b. Brief Review of 2018-2019 Year of JYF, SYF and Life Planning JYF ended the year talking about Christian Character, how faith shapes our attitude, and had a roller-skating party. SYF has been using the S.S. curriculum as a launching pad by using the Gospel project. Life Planning continues to foster relationships between youth and adults in the church. A great and awesome ministry to keep youth engaged with adults in the church.

Old Business – Church Safety and Security Plan – The EA convocation is requiring a security plan in place. More to come later.

New Business

a. Regarding a Request for a Wedding – a non-member couple is seeking use of SJCC for a wedding, and they have asked a family friend to officiate the ceremony. The family friend is an ordained minister through an on-line credentialing web-site and is not a pastor. Pastor Erich is declining their request. Motion to adhere to the current wedding policy as it exists currently, which gives either pastor the authority to say yes or no to wedding requests. Motion approved.

- b. Archbold Evangelical Church has recently listed their church van for sale, a 12-15 passenger vehicle would accommodate many of our trips with small group sizes. Do we want to consider looking into getting another van? Our insurance company didn't really want us to go that route previously due to concerns over roll-over rates. Purchase will not be pursued.
- c. Many people have brought up very positive comments about the special music on Easter sung by Norm and Bruce. There has been a desired request for more up-beat music from the praise band. This topic was discussed at tonight's Spiritual Council meeting. It is being worked on.

Pastoral Discernment and Planning Time

The Spiritual Council and Consistory have approved Pastor Erich's request for a focused time of discernment and planning. Erich will spend two weeks in July for the exclusive purpose of creating short-term (2019-2020) and long-term (next five years) strategies for the ministries of SJCC. Erich requested this special allotment of time for the purpose of planning simply because he has been unable to adequately plan for the future over the past couple of years due to the on-going continual daily and weekly activities of ministry.

During the two weeks, Monday through Friday, he will focus solely on discernment and planning and Pastor Alex and Kelly Stahl will cover all office, staff, worship, committee, teaching and pastoral work. That being said, Erich would certainly be available for pastoral emergencies and funerals. This discerning and planning time will occur between July 1st and 19th, with one week of vacation being added to the two weeks of planning time. Further information will be provided in the July Visitor.

Summer Office Assistant Position

Please know that Katie Wyse has been hired for the summer as an office assistant. Katie will be working to organize all of the church's historical documents – yearbooks, pictorial directories, consistory and committee information, pictures, policy documents and the like. She will also be organizing historical items for display and scanning pictures for future use in bulletins, newsletters and slide shows. Katie will also help with inputting data when a new church office management software is purchased sometime in the next two months. In addition, we hope to have her help with the donated supplies for personalized books and helping with some work in the Christian preschool.

Leadership Development

The Spiritual Council and Consistory of St. John's Christian Church continues to seek discernment from the Lord overseeing all aspects and avenues of Christian church ministry. For the Spiritual Council, which serves as the nominating committee of the congregation, of great importance is the equipping and building up of spiritually minded leaders, to serve as officers, elders, deacons and deaconesses of the congregation.

From Scripture we know that Jesus called twelve disciples, and he interacted with them for the three years prior to his crucifixion, preparing them for leading the church following his death, resurrection and ascension. Jesus equipped those disciples to lead, and though none of them were perfect, for we know of some of their individual weaknesses and we know Judas betrayed Jesus' trust in him, we know the eleven remaining disciples led so well under the authority of Christ that the church continues today.

In Ephesians 4:11-12, Paul wrote: "It was he (Jesus) who gave some to be apostles, some to be prophets, some to be evangelists, and some to be pastors and teachers, to prepare God's people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up..."

We are striving to prepare God's people for works of service, as God calls and equips people to be leaders in Christ's church. In Romans 12:3-8, Paul wrote: "For by the grace given me I say to every one of you: Do not think of yourself more highly than you ought, but rather think of yourself with sober judgment, in accordance with the measure of faith God has given you. 4 Just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have the same function, 5 so in Christ we who are many form one body, and each member belongs to all the others. 6 We have different gifts, according to the grace given us. If a man's gift is prophesying, let him use it in proportion to his faith. 7 If it is serving, let him serve; if it is teaching, let him teach; 8 if it is encouraging, let him encourage; if it is contributing to the needs of others, let him give generously; if it is leadership, let him govern diligently; if it is showing mercy, let him do it cheerfully."

The Spiritual Council is asking everyone to be praying for the people of this congregation that Jesus has equipped to serve and be leaders. The Spiritual Council is praying for discernment and wisdom, asking God to help guide them to men and women He has equipped to lead St. John's.

There is also an awareness that many leaders might not believe they are fully equipped to accept a leadership nomination, so the Spiritual Council will be offering some leadership development classes in the near future – be watching for further information.

Evangelical Association News

The 2019 Annual Convocation of the Evangelical Association will be held here at St. John's on September 20-22. The theme of the three day event is "Equip and Empower," drawing upon Ephesians 4:12 – "To equip God's people to do the works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up." The event includes the following dynamics:

- EA board members arriving on Wednesday evening for a day long board meeting on Thursday
- Approximately 125 people from the EA will enjoy three keynote presentations, eight to twelve different workshops, times of worship, three meals and fellowship on Friday and Saturday
- Sunday morning's message will be brought by Pastor Jim Barnes, National Minister of the EA

To make this all happen, in takes a great team effort, so Pastor Erich and Pastor Alex will be reaching out for everyone's help! More details to come!

Update on the Facility Committee

The membership of the Facility Committee includes Jeff Rutledge (chairperson), Maggie Enderle, Jeremy Hurst, Rich Lesniak, Mike Meyer, Paige Miller, Eric Nafziger, Doug Rupp, Dean Sauder and Pastor Erich.

The Charge or Purpose of the Facility Committee is: In October of 2018, the Consistory approved a recommendation from the Capital Campaign Committee to do something in regards to facility improvements. There is a realization that the capital campaign will take an unknown number of years to realize the \$4.5 million goal and there is an understanding that there are some projects that shouldn't wait, but could be addressed now. Five key areas of our facility will be considered: 1) Accessibility, 2) Restrooms, 3) Kitchen, 4) Sanctuary and 5) Signage.

The committee held their first meeting on May 10th. Committee members are reviewing the 2014 Facility Committee Report and Proposal and other historical documents, and will discuss that information at their next meeting, scheduled for May 29th.
