August Mission-A-Month Back Bay Mission Trip Mission – Service Opportunity – The Mission Committee has planned a day of service with Crossroad Child & Family Services, one of the longest running mission partnerships of SJCC. We're looking for 12 volunteers to serve on Saturday, September 14th. The group will leave the church at 8am and work until 4pm, returning to the church shortly after 5pm. Lunch will be included. A sign-up sheet is posted on the bulletin board. In addition, we have an opportunity to further bless the work and ministry of Crossroad through taking items on their wish list – check out the bulletin board!

**Light Bulb and Electric Receptacle Conversions** – we've got two things going on regarding electricity. First, we have 264 bulbs to change! We are converting all of the 4' florescent bulbs to 4' LED bulbs, which will require opening up the lights, removing the current bulbs and ballasts, some simple rewiring and inserting the new bulbs. Second, we have 36 receptacles we want to replace with child safety receptacles. We are looking for volunteers to help with these two conversions – either working in groups or on your own schedule. #### **SERMON NOTES**

### "Christ's Sacrifice" Hebrews 10

#### Main Points of the Chapter

- Verses 1-18 The superiority of Christ's sacrifice
  - o The old covenant (the law) was a mere shadow of the substance of the new covenant
    - Colossians 2:17, Hebrews 8:5
  - o The animal sacrifices were insufficient
  - o If the old covenant was sufficient, guilt would have been removed, but it wasn't
  - o Shadow the law communicated the outline and the figure of the fulfillment to come in Jesus, but was not the very image
  - o "Made holy through the sacrifice of the body of Jesus Christ once for all"
  - o "Without Christ, you cannot get beyond the shadows of God." (Barclay)
- Interesting imagery
  - o Shadow
  - o Footstool
- The death of Christ fulfills the will of God and perfects those who are being sanctified
- Verses 19-25 Exhortation to draw near and hold fast
  - o Tremendous words of faith
  - o Confidence, Draw Near, Sincere Heart, Full Assurance, Cleanse Us, Unswervingly to the Hope we Profess, Spur One Another On
- Verses 26-39 A warning against rejection
  - o Do people deliberately keep on sinning? Really?
  - o Receiving the knowledge of the truth should bring about a changed heart
  - o Fearful expectation of judgment unheard of in the modern culture
  - o Persevere in doing the will of God
  - o Who am I? 1) Shrink back and are destroyed or 2) Who believe and are saved?

#### **Pioneers**

- Founded in 1979 by former businessman Ted Fletcher and his wife, Peggy, Pioneers partners with local churches to make disciples and initiate church-planting movements among unreached peoples. The unreached are cultural and ethnic groups without a self-sustaining witness to the gospel in their own cultures.
- Jon and Rachel are part of a collaborative partnership of workers, from various organizations and backgrounds united by a commitment to catalyzing churchplanting movements among every major segment of Chicagoland's Muslims.
