pastor's letter

Consider these oft quoted words of Paul from Philippians 3:12-14:

"Not that I have already obtained all this, or have already been made perfect, but I press on to take hold of that for which Christ Jesus took hold of me. Brothers, I do not consider myself yet to have taken hold of it. But one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead, I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus."

Having worked through the significant health issues of my son and myself over the course of the past year, I now sense the very real leading of the Spirit of the Lord to press on, straining toward what is ahead. Prior to Paul's words of verses 12-14, he has written about the "surpassing greatness of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord." Knowing Christ is indeed the greatest joy of all, for in and through Christ we are enabled to live a full life of grace, love and faithfulness.

Grace – forgetting what is behind, forgiving and forgetting any discord, any ill will, any strife between ourselves and someone else. Grace – building new bridges, setting aside differences, seeking unity in Christ. Listening to the Lord, and listening to one another with heart and compassion.

Love – Christ's love. An acceptance of all people, no matter our differences or our divergent lifestyles or life goals, and an acceptance that we are all sinners, no one is perfect, and yet Christ loves us all. An acceptance of Christ's loving command to be holy – our priority is to be Christ-like, to seek the Lord's will for our lives. Paul was pressing on towards God's calling upon his life, not his own individual wants and desires. Love calls us to welcome and accept one another as children of God, but the same love calls us to rebuke (2 Timothy 4:2) one another. The popular mantra of "just do it" is focused on doing what we each personally want to do, where the Christian mantra is expressed in the former popular mantra, "What Would Jesus Do," out of our love for Christ Jesus.

Faithfulness – no matter the circumstances swirling around Paul, his focus remained heavenward. His energy, his drive, his work was pointed toward faithfulness to God. That's the example we each are challenged to strive towards.

From the fruitful work of the Discernment Team and the two weeks of discernment I pastorally experienced in July, I've shared a document of goals with the Consistory. There are 125 short-term goals listed in that document. These goals focus on several key aspects of ministry here at SJCC: administrative, leadership, facility, worship, Christian Education, youth ministry, fellowship, evangelism, missions, pastoral care, preschool and historical.

As the Consistory discusses and assesses each of these goals, the results will be shared with everyone in the congregation, and my prayer is that each of us will seek a leading of the Spirit as we faithfully press on in the ministries and focus of the church – sharing the gospel of Jesus Christ for the salvation of souls.

Back Bay Mission Trip - October 5th - 12th, 2019

There is room for twelve participants for this annual fall trip, and there are only nine signed up so far. We've learned that the project being planned for the group is the work of framing two houses which are being built side by side, though they are two different floor plans. Framing a house is a great way for people of any skill level and of any age to get involved, for there are many different tasks in the process. We will be sharing the mission house and the project with a group of youth and adults from a church from Columbus.

The group is scheduled to gather at 7am on Saturday morning and start the 15 hour road trip to Biloxi. We'll stop for the night near Cullman, Alabama and continue the trip on Sunday morning. There will be an orientation time with Back Bay Mission on both Sunday evening and Monday morning. On Thursday morning, the group will participate in a Back Bay Mission program called "In Their Shoes" – educating participants about poverty and homelessness.

The group will head for home sometime Friday afternoon and return to the church by Saturday afternoon, after spending Friday night near Brentwood, Tennessee.

Cost of the trip this year remains at \$250 per person – which covers transportation, lodging, meals and a materials fee for the Mission. Funds from the mission committee provide further support.

Habitat for Humanity of Fulton County Ohio-(HFHFCO)

The home is being built at 910 Zenobia Street in Wauseon, and is being built for a family of five – father, mother and three young children. Volunteer work days are held each Friday and Saturday. People interested in helping can go to the HFHFCO website at https://habitatfco.org to see the work schedule and register, or you can contact Pastor Erich. As of the week of 9/16, the majority of the exterior work is complete and volunteers will soon begin to install insulation and drywall.

They ask for continued prayer for the residents in the men's and women's shelters, that they would seek and find relationship with God and begin to put their lives here on earth back together and be productive citizens again.

Usually by the end of the summer the shelves at TGRM are looking rather bare. Please place donated non-perishable food items in the white mission box outside the chapel area. You may also give monetary donations by marking TGRM on your offering envelopes. Thank you for your support in caring for God's people!

November 17 is the next time we'll send a group of folks to lead the evening chapel service and provide the evening meal. Volunteers usually gather at 3pm on Sunday afternoon to car pool to the mission, do final prep for the meal and service, lead the 30 minute service, then serve the meal, and enjoy sitting and eating with the men and women who come to the mission. 
preschool corner

Church Treasurer

With the pending retirement of Roger Miller as the church treasurer, the Personnel Committee is beginning the process of searching for the next treasurer of the church. The following job description has been a proved by the Consistory:

Church Treasurer Job Description (August 6, 2019)

The church treasurer is responsible for management of the church's tithes, offerings and finances, including the duties associated with the collection, recording, management, investment, and spending of the church's money.

Position Description

The church treasurer will work with the Consistory to manage the church's finances and attend to general bookkeeping, payroll, and tax responsibilities.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities of a Church Treasurer

- 1. Oversees the collection, sorting, recording and deposit of offerings, donations and other income each week, with assistance from the Ushers, Administrative Assistant and Offering Assistants.
- 2. In conjunction with the Administrative Assistant, issues receipts for large donations.
- 3. Keeps detailed records of all financial transactions.
- 4. Payroll manages payroll of church employees, ensuring accurate and timely processing of payroll, remittance and filing of taxes, preparation of tax forms (i.e. W-2's, 1099's), and health insurance online compliance forms with the government.
- 5. Assists the Personnel Committee with pre-hire forms such as I-9's and W-4's
- 6. Provides church ledger to the Administrative Assistant, who will reconciles church bank statements with the church's ledger.
- 7. Works with the Budget and Stewardship Committee to invest large donations to supplement the church's trust.
- 8. Assists in tracking investments and delivers quarterly earnings statement to the church's board.
- 9. Presents a quarterly statement on the church's finances to church members and donors.
- 10.Participates in any financial audits.
- 11.Inspires confidence from the congregation and the staff as to his or her integrity and ability.
- 12. Attends meetings with the church executive staff to go over finances and stay aware of any upcoming expenses, events, or changes to the church's operation.

Required Knowledge, Skills and Abilities

- 1. Must have strong general competencies with bookkeeping, financial auditing, investing, accounting, and processing.
- 2. Must be very well organized and have an exceptional attention to detail.
- 3. Must be trustworthy and honest in all dealings.
- 4. Must be committed to the mission and goals of the church.
- 5. Must be familiar with the tax code as governs religious and non-profit entities.
- 6. Must be willing to research and learn more about effective financial practices, accounting, bookkeeping and filing taxes.
- 7. Must be able to work well with church staff, volunteers, committee members, and the church's leadership.
- 8. Must be comfortable being supervised in a close capacity.
- 9. Must be committed to the confidentiality of all donations and financial information.

10. Must be familiar with Microsoft Excel and with Quick Books.

Education and Experience

1. Preferably will have a bachelor's degree in finance, accounting, or business.

2. Must have experience as a CPA, treasurer of a company or organization, or finance management.
