## pastor's letter

During the recently concluded mission trip with Back Bay Mission, the group of twelve participants framed the roof structure of a one-story home. The home was 38' x 54' in size and included three bedrooms, two baths and a garage. Framing the roof included measuring, cutting and installing 70 18' common rafters, 30 8' common rafters, 4 doubled corner hip rafters and 24 jack rafters. Once all the rafters were screwed and nailed in place, attic support walls were set in place to help carry the roof's load, and then the sub-facia boards were nailed in place, which required the cutting of the tails of all those rafters. After all of that, the roof sheathing could be nailed in place! After four and half days of work, the group nailed on just over half the roof sheathing, leaving the project



unfinished, but knowing the next group would take it from there. One of the key lessons learned through such projects is that each group is just one part of a large and lengthy process – several volunteer groups over the course of the next several months will do their part to complete this home build, so that it can be purchased by a low-income homeowner.

A central purpose of the trip is to live out the Parable of the Sheep and the Goats, a lesson Jesus offers in Matthew 25. Back Bay Mission is involved in providing for the hungry and thirsty, offering hospitality to strangers, providing clothing for those needing clothes, looking after the sick and visiting those in prison – realizing that the "prison" most of their clientele are caught in is the prison of poverty and homelessness. Each volunteer group is part of an on-going never-ending process to share the love and compassion of Jesus. The ministry is never done. Each seed that is planted is represented by each of the rafters that were set in place. Each group has an opportunity to share in the mission and ministry of Back Bay Mission, handing the baton of ministry off to the next group that comes along.

Gloria Lauber renewed her sisterly relationship with her friend, Anita; the group shared the mission house with a retired pastor and his wife, who were from northeastern Ohio; and the group had some interactions with neighbors of the home under construction. Parking our large white church bus along the street each day certainly let the people know we traveled all the way from Ohio to lend a helping hand.

A tremendous blessing of the trip is the ever-deepening friendships of the twelve people on the trip. Everyone had been to Back Bay Mission before, some for many, many trips. The mutual support, the humorous bantering, the lessons shared, the prayers said, the scriptures considered – all flow from the mission of Back Bay Mission, Micah 6:8 – "And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God."

While our mission trips to Biloxi or to Michigan City or to the Dominican Republic or to Kenya are special focused experiences, doing what the Lord requires of us happens here in our own home towns – volunteering with one of the many area Christian based ministries, serving in one or more of our church's ministries, sharing God's word and love with our neighbors and coworkers, with the people we sit next to in the stadium bleachers or the people we wait in line with at the store.

Let us each be part of the process - one step at a time - trusting in God's guiding hand.

The Friendship House is endorsed by the Archbold Area Ministerial Association and is coordinated by a volunteer board.

The main need of the Friendship House at this point is further financial support for operating expenses. This month we ask that you prayerfully consider supporting this community ministry that strives to care for those in need of a place to stay and have a fresh start in life.



#### Summer Mission Trip – June 14th – 19th

Plans are set for another week of serving with the LaPorte County Habitat for Humanity affiliate in Michigan City, IN. Participants will head to Tower Hill Church Camp on Sunday afternoon, June 13th, spend Monday through Friday framing a new home, and return to Archbold late afternoon on June 19th.

Breakfasts and dinners are enjoyed in the camp dining hall – their meals have always been top notch. Lunches are provided by churches and local restaurants at the work site. The relaxing evenings are spent enjoying friendly fellowship, a possible 10 to 15 minute walk to the beach along Lake Michigan, some Corn Hole games and who knows what else! Typically, the group enjoys one or two evening meals at local restaurants! People of all skill levels are invited to join in the week – Habitat for Humanity provides able supervision. Cost of the experience is \$125 and assistance is always available. A sign-up sheet for this work and fellowship experience is on the board!

#### Dominican Republic Mission Trip – June 13th – 20th

The plans continue to be finalized for this cross-cultural experience. Ten senior high youth and six adults of the congregation will be participating in this week long trip. This group of sixteen will be partnering with twenty people from Pettisville Missionary Church, who take annual excursions to Freedom International's mission school. SJCC and PMC support two missionary families serving at Freedom – Jason & Becky Suon and Daniel and Bethany Schrock – so they will be meeting up with familiar faces upon their arrival!

#### Mission Trip to Kenya, Kajiado Children's Home 2020

- David and Crissi Stuckey will be traveling to Kajiado Children's Home in June as board members of the Hope for Kajiado Charity and representatives of St John's Christian Church. They are looking forward to meeting the children and staff at the home and seeing the facility first hand. Additional information about the home can be found at www.hope4kajiado.org.
- They are humbly asking you to consider ways you could help as they prepare for and participate in this trip. Please pray for them for travel safety and protection from illness. Pray that they would have a good interaction with the staff and the children. Pray that they can be of help to the home as they complete work projects to be assigned.
- If you wish, you can send some small gifts with them as they would be glad to deliver them for you. They will be able to transport donation items in the extra suitcases.
- Gifts and donations for children ages 4 to 17 could include:
  - a. Underwear (the girls prefer bikini panties), Socks, Bras, Camisoles, Tights, Shoes (black leather is required for attendance at school), Gently used or new children's clothes.
  - b. Longer shorts and pants or any kind of shirt (pullover or button-up) for the boys.
  - c Lightweight to heavier jackets.
  - d. Inexpensive costume jewelry, crayons, puzzles, colored pencils, beanie baby or small stuffed

toy animals, a small ball, small toy cars or trucks, a small photo book with pictures of your family.

It may be helpful to keep the following in mind while gathering gifts. Girls do not wear shorts but wear tights under dresses which must be to the knee. They do not wear pants at KCH, but some do wear them when they go to their villages during school breaks. It is very cool there so hot summer clothes like sleeveless shirts or spaghetti tops are not the best choice. There should not be bathing suits. The clothing should have prints suitable in a Christian environment. Avoid war, drugs, foul language, etc.

Thanks to the "Stitching Sisters" who are making hats for them to take.

David and Crissi look forward to sharing their experiences with the church family when they return.

#### **Scholarship Information**

College & Seminary Scholarships

St. John's Christian Church offers and administers four scholarships:

- 1. Springer Scholarship for students enrolled in seminary, pre-seminary or Christian Ed. studies
- 2. Nursing Scholarship for a nursing student who is a member of SJCC and who attends an accredited post-secondary school of nursing
- 3. College Scholarship awarded to enhance the Christian faith of active members of St. John's Christian Church who are either attending or planning to attend college in the coming year
- 4. Seminary Scholarship tuition scholarships for students attending seminary

#### **Property Committee**

The Property Committee has been working to address several property issues:

- 1. Sidewalk Snow Removal the people who had been lined up to clear the walks during the week informed the committee in early February that they were no longer able to clear the walks, so the Property Committee is looking for people willing to help them clear the walks prior to 8am Monday through Friday.
- 2. Boiler a pressure relief valve and drain valve were recently replaced as part of the ongoing upkeep of the boiler system.
- 3. Parish Hall Heating/Cooling Unit the installation of the new unit is ongoing.
- 4. Blue Spruce Tree the large spruce located southwest of the chapel will be removed due to an ongoing infestation of bag worms and deterioration of the tree's branches.
- 5. Digital Sign the committee continues to gather information from three companies, including having digital sign demonstrations from two of the companies, for the installation of a digital LED sign, which will be located west of the chapel. Final renderings and details of the sign will be shared with Consistory and then the Congregation in the next few months. As part of this project, the present lighted sign will be removed, as well as removal of the stone wall and landscaped area where the original church sign was located west of the parlor window. Funds towards the purchase and installation of the sign have been donated to the church, in the sum of \$45,000.
- 6. Lights the light bulbs high above the chancel steps in the sanctuary were recently replaced with LED bulbs, but one of the bulbs quit working. The light bulbs on the eastern most light pole in the south parking lot are not working properly. The committee is in contact with Creighton Electric for replacement of the bulb and/or fixtures.
