pastoral prayer - Sunday, April 26

"How suitable, how necessary it is that this plague and pestilence, which seems horrible and deadly, searches out the justice of each and every one and examines the mind of the human race; whether the [healthy] care for the sick, whether relatives dutifully love kinsmen as they should...whether physicians do not desert the afflicted."

-Cyprian, Bishop of Carthage, 3rd Century AD

Lord God, Cyprian saw how the coronavirus of his day tested each person, revealing each person's heart. In the day of testing, would they forsake family, for the sake of self? Would they forsake the sick, for the sake of their own health? Would doctors abandon their patients, to preserve their own lives?

Today, O Lord, we pray especially for all those serving in healthcare capacities:

1. We pray first, that their faith might rest in you. Even as personal risk in serving others abounds, may their faith always put before them the eternal security they have in Christ, and so grant them a peace that passes worldly understanding.

2. Second, we pray that their faith in you might fuel their continued sacrificial service. Encourage them that they might not flee their posts, but continue their service in love for those who are in need.

3. Third, we pray for their physical health. In your great mercy, O Lord, spare them from illness, especially the coronavirus.

4. Fourth, we pray for their families. May they also have faith which rests in you, peace in Christ which passes understanding, a love which fuels sacrifice, and the sweet gift of good health.

5. Fifth, we pray for their patients. Grant treatments to be successful and patients to regain health and wellbeing. Grant also that thankful hearts might be led to you, the giver and sustainer of all life. Grant that those who perish might first hear the gospel, and grant them faith to believe so that in the life to come they will be resurrected unto eternal life.

6. Sixth, we pray for their fellow citizens. May we all, O Lord, do our part, in both prayer and cautious living, to slow the spread of sickness, and thereby serve and help protect those serving in healthcare.

7. Seventh, we pray for the researchers working to find a cure. O Lord, grant them success in their work that many lives might be spared.

O Lord, as we unite our hearts in prayer, we find rest in your present and eternal care. We praise you, Lord Jesus, Author of Life and Author of our Salvation. May all glory, honor, and praise be yours, forever and ever, amen.



May Mission-A-Month Cherry Street Mission Ministries

Cherry Street was founded on Biblical principles in 1947, and remains a Biblicallybased, Christ centered organization today. Their Spiritual Advocates consist of both staff and volunteers that lead Bible studies daily and mentor guests through their journey with Christ. Cherry Street has a Men's Division, Women's Division (Sparrow's Nest) and food services.

Each night, Cherry Street provides safe, free shelter for nearly 230 men and women who would otherwise sleep on the street or remain in an abusive situation. For some, it's the first night they've slept safely in a very long time.

Cherry Street is more than food, clothing and shelter. Their redemptive programming is built around one on one discipleship. They care more about who a person is, rather than what a person has become.

Cherry Street is the only organization in the region to offer 3 meals a day, 7 days a week, free of charge to anyone who needs them. Cherry Street gratefully accepts financial donations and gift-in-kind donations (anything donated that is not cash).
