

#### Worship Service Scripture Readings *Psalm* 85

You showed favor to your land, O LORD; you restored the fortunes of Jacob. 2 You forgave the iniquity of your people and covered all their sins. Selah 3 You set aside all your wrath and turned from your fierce anger. 4 Restore us again, O God our Savior, and put away your displeasure toward us. 5 Will you be angry with us forever? Will you prolong your anger through all generations? 6 Will you not revive us again, that your people may rejoice in you? 7 Show us your unfailing love, O LORD, and grant us your salvation. 8 I will listen to what God the LORD will say; he promises peace to his people, his saints-but let them not return to folly. 9 Surely his salvation is near those who fear him, that his glory may dwell in our land. 10 Love and faithfulness meet together; righteousness and peace kiss each other. 11 Faithfulness springs forth from the earth, and righteousness looks down from heaven. 12 The LORD will indeed give what is good, and our land will yield its harvest. 13 Righteousness goes before him and prepares the way for his steps.

# October Mission-A-Month Operation Christmas Child

Operation Christmas Child is a mission that strives to get needed supplies and the Word of salvation to children living in dire conditions throughout the world. In October we collect items to be included in cardboard boxes that will be packed by volunteers here at our church. If you want to pack your own box, please contact the church office so we can provide you with a box; otherwise you can place donated items in the white mission box in the Chapel narthex, or dive monetary donations using your offering envelops or sending your donation to the church office.

A list of items to be donated or packed includes: Toothbrushes, socks, hats, gloves, dolls (girls only), pencils, pens, notebooks, coloring books (with the least amount of words possible), crayons or colored pencisl, pencil sharpener, hairbrush/comb, boxes of band aids, washcloths, bars of soap, hair bows, chapstick, sunglasses, flip flops, and any other toys like puzzles, cars, etc. Please NO food, candy or toothpaste, liquids or lotions, medications or vitamins, breakable items such as snow globes or glass containers, aerosol cans, war-related items such as toy guns, knives or military figures, and refrain from packing or donating stuffed animals or animal-related things because they cannot be sent to some countries.

#### Health and Safety Guidelines

We encourage everyone to abide by these hygiene and safety practices:

- Wear a facial covering when in the building, unless you meet one of the exemptions.
- Sanitize/wash hands frequently and cover coughs and sneezes.
- Stay home if you are sick, not feeling well, or live with or care for someone who is sick or not feeling well.
- Maintain 6' social distancing, including in the pews. Be mindful of people around you.

#### Resumption of Church Ministries – October 2020 Update

- 1. Preschool Sunday School and Logos Preschool after careful consideration, we will hold off restarting ministries for our young children.
- 2. As SJCC resumes Sunday school, Faith Village, Bible Studies, Small Groups, Logos, JYF, SYF, Life Planning and Music Ministries, we'll follow these protocols:

A. Symptom Assessments – daily symptom assessments upon arrival – If any of the following symptoms are present, attendee will be isolated and parents will be contacted: fever of 100.4 degrees or above, chills, cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fatigue, achy, headache, new loss of taste or smell, sore throat, congestion, runny nose, nausea, vomiting or diarrhea.

#### B. Sanitization

i. Before and after classes/sessions – hand sanitizer will be used by each person when entering the room and when leaving the room.

ii. Containers of hand-sanitizer will be placed in each room for individual use

iii. Frequently touched surfaces – door knobs, light switches, tables and chairs – will be sanitized between groups using a room.

iv. Specific items will be removed from rooms facilitate the sanitizing efforts C. Snacks/Refreshments

i. Items will be pre-packaged/individually wrapped.

ii. Hand-sanitizer will be used before and after any eating.

iii. People will be spaced out so face coverings can be removed while eating. D. Contact Tracing

i. Attendance will be taken for each class/group setting.

ii. Participants will be given their own supplies to use, though groups of 10 or less may share some items (see the next point).

iii. Large groups will be divided in to smaller groups of 10 or less, with those smaller groups being maintained throughout the class/session time, with 1 adult per group of children. The following situations are examples:

a. For FV Gathering Time – a maximum of 17 children and 3 adults will be able to gather in The Well, with half the children on the north end of the room and half the children on the south. If attendance is higher than 17, another room will be ready for use, with prepared leaders

b. There are plenty of rooms upstairs for FV groups to be spread out.c. For Junior Choir Practice – children will be spaced out in groups of ten or less, with multiple pew spacing in between each group.d. For JYF – Youth will be divided into groups of 9 or less, with 1 adult per group, with the large group utilizing a large space in the building, such as the gym, chapel, or confirmation room.

E. Attendees will not congregate in groups before or after classes/sessions unless facial coverings are worn and social distancing guidelines are followed.

## F. Best Practices

i. Physical distancing (6ft. or more) observed at all times, when possible.
ii. Activities involving "group/hands on" will be altered for social distancing.
iii. Velcro dots will be placed on the floors and/or on the walls of the various rooms so people can see where to stand/sit/line-up to stay spaced out.
iv. Sanitizing wipes will be available for sanitizing any shared items after use.

## G. Logos Meal/Start Time/Schedule

i. For the time being, no Logos meal will be served on Wednesday evenings
ii. 6:45PM – Logos gathering time in the gym – each age group (with 9 or less in subgroups with 1 adult per group) gathers in a specific spot in the gym
iii. 6:55PM – 1st thru 5th Graders will move in their respective small groups to the sanctuary for worship skills; social distance between groups

iv. 7:25PM – 1st thru 5th Graders will move in their respective small groups to their individual classrooms for Bible study

iv. 7:55PM – Preschool through 5th Grade will move in their small groups to the gym for closing and pick up by parent(s)

#### H. Youth/Adult Ministries

i. Confirmation – will meet in the confirmation room, which is a doable class-room space to allow for social distanced seating

ii. Senior High Class – will meet in the youth room, which is large enough to allow for social distanced seating

iii. Forerunners Class – will meet in the Fireside Room pending number of people in attendance for appropriate social distancing; if the attendance is greater than the room can safely hold, the class might be divided into two classes for the time being, with one class remaining in the Fireside Room and the second class meeting in another first floor space

iv. B.A.S.I.C. Class – will meet in the gym, with dividing curtains in place to improve audio atmosphere

v. Women's Class – will meet in the parlor

vi. Connections Class – will meet in the chapel

vii. JYF – will meet in the gym and Fireside Room

viii. SYF – will meet in the youth room

ix. Life Planning – will meet in the chapel

x. Tuesday Bible Study – will meet in the chapel
