Pastoral Letter

A Thought from Pastor Erich...

"When they (the magi) had gone, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream. "Get up," he said, "take the child and his mother and escape to Egypt. Stay there until I tell you, for Herod is going to search for the child to kill him." ¹⁴So he got up, took the child and his mother during the night and left for Egypt, where he stayed until the death of Herod." (Matthew 2:13-14, NIV)

Why was it necessary for Joseph to take Mary and Jesus to Egypt? Wasn't there an alternative? This was the Lord's son! Why didn't God deal with Herod in a way that Joseph didn't have to go to Egypt, but could directly return to their home in Nazareth? The boys of Bethlehem who were two years old and under could have been saved if God had removed Herod from power.

Yes, it is true that the prophecies from Hosea 11:1 (Matthew 2:15) and Jeremiah 31:15 (Matthew 2:18) were fulfilled in the way history played out, but there could have been a different plan, one in which there was no need for escape or mourning.

This is another one of those dilemmas in which I'm reminded of Isaiah 55:8-9: ""For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways," declares the Lord. ⁹ "As the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts."" (NIV)

Though I can wonder why God took the action he did, I must recognize that God did indeed take sovereign action to preserve his son. God did save Jesus from the severe cruelty of Herod. God saved Jesus according to his will, his plan. In faith, I trust God's plan, and I don't need to understand it all. That's the truth of 2 Corinthians 5:7 – "We live by faith, not by sight."

I trust there are millions of Christians who have been praying for God's intervention amidst this lengthy pandemic. When will it end? Why doesn't God act? The pandemic is so devastating in the number of lives lost and in the number of serious cases of illness, as well as with the financial and mental health ramifications. It's so disruptive. It's so inconvenient. It's so politicized. It's so... (fill in your own statement). God certainly has the power and authority to command relief. Why hasn't he?

God hasn't answered that question for me. And I don't need to know. I live by faith. We live by faith. I pray that everyone who reads these words will continue to put their faith into practice – trust in God, keep God first in your heart, honor God with your devotion and love, and do what you can to love one another.

Your generosity this year has been overwhelming. What a beautiful reminder you are the Lord's provision!


Due in part to your generous giving, I have been freed up to engage wholeheartedly in the pastoral work entrusted to me. And God has been doing some amazing things!

Here is a glimpse of what you have been investing in over the past year:

- 13 baptisms (mostly students).
- Virtual discipleship that has brought several to faith.
- Students and staff are meeting together weekly and discipling one another in both virtual and in -person home groups.
- Before the pandemic, we gave a sermon series on Holy Sexuality and provided some resources & groups for students to discuss the Christian sexual ethic with grace and truth.
- Feeding 65 families in SE Ann Arbor and Ypsilanti
- Providing a bed for an elderly woman who had been sleeping on the floor.
- Providing backpacks and school supplies to children in SE Ann Arbor.
- Multiple Red Cross blood drives.
- Regular discipleship groups [focusing on] living lifestyles of Worship, Community, and Mission.
- 4 new student interns, 1 new campus missionary, and another graduating senior planning to go on staff as a campus missionary.

God is active in moving powerfully, even during a pandemic. Please continue to pray for our limited in -person services and outreach to students in a time when schedules and interactions look very different. Thank you so much for your partnership in the gospel. It is such a joy to celebrate with you!

SAVE THE DATE: Annual Congregational Meeting

January 17, 2021 at 11:00AM
