Scripture Readings

Psalm 139:1-6

O Lord, you have searched me and you know me. ²You know when I sit and when I rise; you perceive my thoughts from afar. ³You discern my going out and my lying down; you are familiar with all my ways. ⁴Before a word is on my tongue you know it completely, O Lord. ⁵You hem me in-- behind and before; you have laid your hand upon me. ⁶Such knowledge is too wonderful for me, too lofty for me to attain.

John 1:43-51

The next day Jesus decided to leave for Galilee. Finding Philip, he said to him, "Follow me." ⁴⁴ Philip, like Andrew and Peter, was from the town of Bethsaida. ⁴⁵ Philip found Nathanael and told him, "We have found the one Moses wrote about in the Law, and about whom the prophets also wrote, -- Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph." ⁴⁶ "Nazareth! Can anything good come from there?" Nathanael asked. "Come and see," said Philip. ⁴⁷ When Jesus saw Nathanael approaching, he said of him, "Here is a true Israelite, in whom there is nothing false." ⁴⁸ "How do you know me?" Nathanael asked. Jesus answered, "I saw you while you were still under the fig tree before Philip called you." ⁴⁹ Then Nathanael declared, "Rabbi, you are the Son of God; you are the King of Israel." ⁵⁰ Jesus said, "You believe be cause I told you I saw you under the fig tree. You shall see greater things than that." ⁵¹ He then added, "I tell you the truth, you shall see heaven open, and the angels of God ascending and descending on the Son of Man."

Congregational Prayer

Sermon Notes

Sermon "Good Coming Forth" Scripture John 1:43-51 (Revised Common Lectionary Reading)

The gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke include an account of the baptism of Jesus. John's gospel includes an account of John describing the baptism of Jesus (John 1:32-34).

Following Jesus' baptism, Matthew's gospel says that Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert for forty days and forty nights, then the tempter came to him. In Mark and Luke, Jesus was in the desert forty days, being tempted by Satan. John's gospel does not mention the temptation.

In all four gospels, either right after the baptism and temptation, or sometime after those two events, Jesus begins to call his disciples and begins his public ministry.

John 1:35-42 ("The next day...")

- The calling of Andrew, who went and found his brother, Simon (Peter)
- Andrew came to Jesus through John the Baptist's message
- Simon Peter came to Jesus because of the witness of his brother

John 1:43-51 ("The next day...")

- The calling of Philip "follow me" (a simple statement)
- Philip found Nathanael "come and see" (another simple statement)
 "Can anything good come out of Nazareth?" Nathanael asks
- John 1:50-51 "Jesus said, 'You believe because I told you I saw you under the fig tree. You shall see greater things than that.' ⁵¹ He then added, 'I tell you the truth, you shall see heaven open, and the angels of God ascending and descending on the Son of Man.'"
- Nathanael reveals his prejudice
- Philip does not argue with Nathanael, but invites him to meet Jesus
- Jesus offers a "sign" to Nathanael, and Nathanael responds with praise
- Then Jesus promises greater signs will be seen
- Philip came to Jesus through a direct call of Jesus
- Nathaniel came to Jesus at the invitation of a friend, Philip, and encountered Jesus

Sermon Notes (cont.)

- How did you come to Jesus?
- Have you ever invited someone to "Come and see (Jesus)?"
- Let's see "good coming forth" from people, welcoming and inviting people to Jesus.

January Mission-A-Month: Emergency Cleanup Kits

Our January Mission-A-Month works in cooperation with Church World Service to provide Emergency Cleanup Buckets and Kits for families and communities affected by natural disasters such as tornadoes and flooding. Kits are filled with items like cleaning towels, heavy-duty gloves, sponges, laundry detergent, dish soap, and more. Donations can be made through the church office or through your weekly offering envelope.

Health and Safety Guidelines

We encourage everyone to abide by these hygiene and safety practices:

- Wear a facial covering when in the building, unless you meet one of the exemptions.
- Sanitize/wash hands frequently and cover coughs and sneezes.
