Scripture Readings

Psalm 118:1-2 Give thanks to the LORD, for he is good; his love endures forever. ² Let Israel say: "His love endures forever."

Psalm 118:19-29 Open for me the gates of righteousness; I will enter and give thanks to the LORD. ²⁰ This is the gate of the LORD through which the righteous may enter. 21 I will give you thanks, for you answered me; you have become my salvation. ²² The stone the builders rejected has become the capstone; ²³ the LORD has done this, and it is marvelous in our eyes. ²⁴ This is the day the LORD has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it. ²⁵ O LORD, save us; O LORD, grant us success. ²⁶ Blessed is he who comes in the name of the LORD. From the house of the LORD we bless you. ²⁷ The LORD is God, and he has made his light shine upon us. With boughs in hand, join in the festal procession up to the horns of the altar. 28 You are my God, and I will give you thanks; you are my God, and I will exalt you. 29 Give thanks to the LORD, for he is good; his love endures forever.

Mark 11:1-11 As they approached Jerusalem and came to Bethphage and Bethany at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two of his disciples, ² saying to them, "Go to the village ahead of you, and just as you enter it, you will find a colt tied there, which no one has ever ridden. Untie it and bring it here. ³ If anyone asks you, 'Why are you doing this?' tell him, 'The Lord needs it and will send it back here shortly.'" ⁴ They went and

found a colt outside in the street, tied at a doorway. As they untied it, ⁵ some people standing there asked, "What are you doing, untying that colt?" 6 They answered as Jesus had told them to, and the people let them go. 7 When they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks over it, he sat on it. 8 Many people spread their cloaks on the road, while others spread branches they had cut in the fields. 9 Those who went ahead and those who followed shouted. "Hosanna!" "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!" 10 "Blessed is the coming kingdom of our father David!" "Hosanna in the highest!" 11 Jesus entered Jerusalem and went to the temple. He looked around at everything, but since it was already late, he went out to Bethany with the Twelve.

Philippians 2:5-11 Your attitude should be the same as that of Christ Jesus: 6 Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be grasped, ⁷ but made himself nothing, taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. 8 And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself and became obedient to death-- even death on a cross! ⁹ Therefore God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name, 10 that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, 11 and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Sermon "Approaching Jerusalem"

Scripture Mark 11:1-11, Philippians 2:5-11 (Revised Common Lectionary Reading)

Setting of the City of Jerusalem

- The city sits on hills at an elevation of 2,575 feet, with the Mount of Olives 100 feet higher
- To the east, the city looks down on the Dead Sea and across the Jordan River, 18 miles away, to the arid mountains of the mountains of Moab. To the west, the city faces the coastal plain and the Mediterranean Sea, about 32 miles distant





As Jesus Approached Jerusalem...

- Luke 19 passing through Jericho, Jesus meets Zacchaeus and goes to his house to eat
- Mark 10:46 passing through Jericho, Jesus meets and heals Bartimaeus, a blind man
- Jesus and his disciples climbed up along the road from Jericho to Jerusalem, passing by the Mount of Olives, then from there they walked down the hillside to Jerusalem
- Luke 19:41 as Jesus approached Jerusalem and saw the city, he wept over it
- Matthew 21, Mark 11, Luke 19:23, John 12:12 Jesus sat astride a colt, or donkey
- Matthew 21, Mark 11, Luke 19:23, John 12:12 Jesus was greeted by the crowds

As We Approach Holy Week...

- Remember that Jesus met and ate with sinners
- Remember that Jesus healed people
- Remember that Jesus traveled a difficult route
- Remember that Jesus wept as the city did not recognize his peace
- Remember that Jesus came as a humble servant
- Remember that Jesus was greeted by a raucous crowd, who jeered him a few days later
