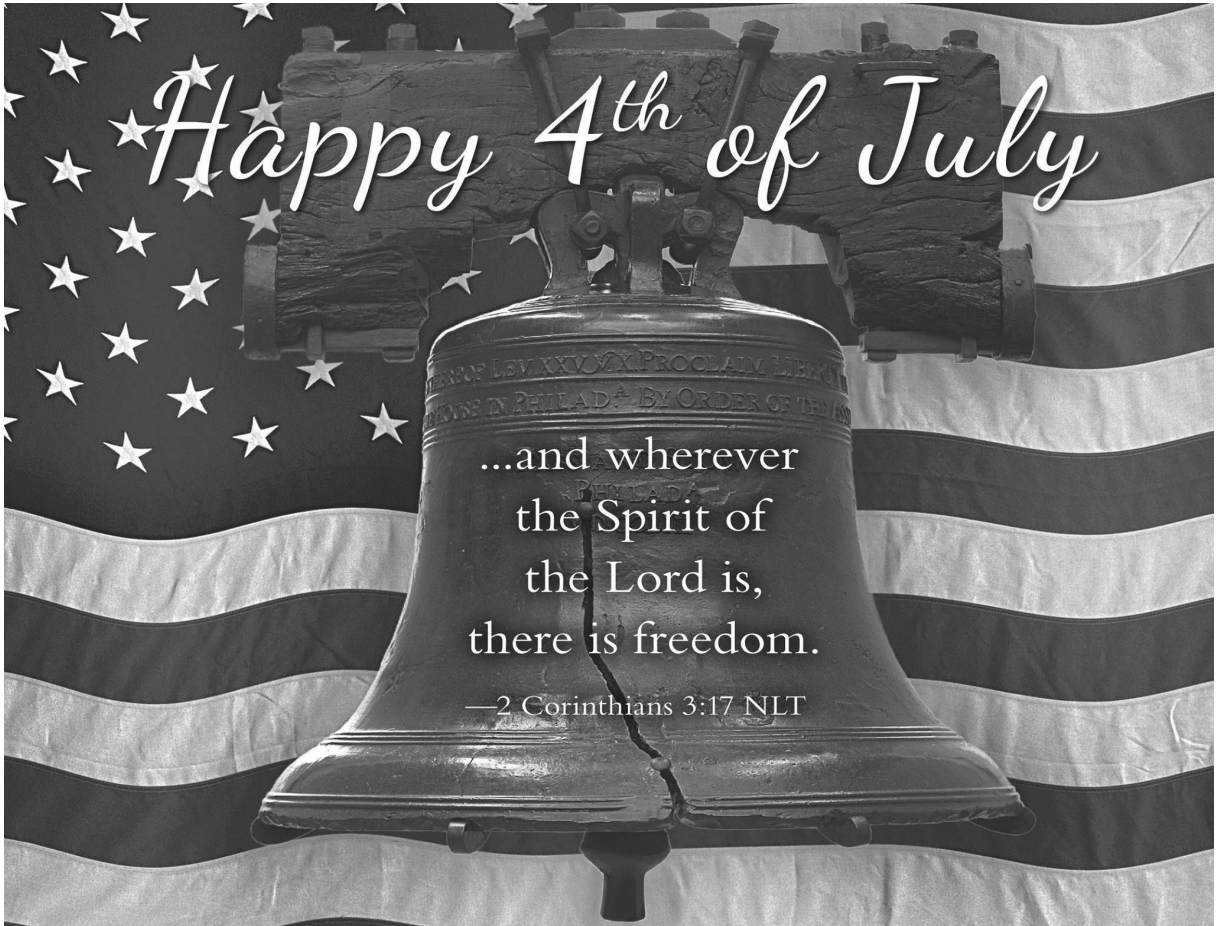

Scripture Readings

Psalms 48:9-14 Within your temple, O God, we meditate on your unfailing love. ¹⁰ Like your name, O God, your praise reaches to the ends of the earth; your right hand is filled with righteousness. ¹¹ Mount Zion rejoices, the villages of Judah are glad because of your judgments. ¹² Walk about Zion, go around her, count her towers, ¹³ consider well her ramparts, view her citadels, that you may tell of them to the next generation. ¹⁴ For this God is our God for ever and ever; he will be our guide even to the end.

Mark 6:1-13 Jesus left there and went to his hometown, accompanied by his disciples. ² When the Sabbath came, he began to teach in the synagogue, and many who heard him were amazed. "Where did this man get these things?" they asked. "What's this wisdom that has been given him, that he even does miracles!" ³ Isn't this the carpenter? Isn't this Mary's son and the brother of James, Joseph, Judas and Simon? Aren't his sisters here with us?" And they took offense at him. ⁴ Jesus said to them, "Only in his hometown, among his relatives and in his own house is a prophet without honor." ⁵ He could not do any miracles there, except lay his hands on a few sick people and heal them. ⁶ And he was amazed at their lack of faith. Then Jesus went around teaching from village to village. ⁷ Calling the Twelve to him, he sent them out two by two and gave them authority over evil spirits. ⁸ These were his instructions: "Take nothing for the journey except a staff-- no bread, no bag, no money in your belts. ⁹ Wear sandals but not an extra tunic. ¹⁰ Whenever you enter a house, stay there until you leave that town.

¹¹ And if any place will not welcome you or listen to you, shake the dust off your feet when you leave, as a testimony against them." ¹² They went out and preached that people should repent. ¹³ They drove out many demons and anointed many sick people with oil and healed them.

2 Corinthians 12:2-10 I know a man in Christ who fourteen years ago was caught up to the third heaven. Whether it was in the body or out of the body I do not know -- God knows. ³ And I know that this man -- whether in the body or apart from the body I do not know, but God knows -- ⁴ was caught up to paradise. He heard inexpressible things, things that man is not permitted to tell. ⁵ I will boast about a man like that, but I will not boast about myself, except about my weaknesses. ⁶ Even if I should choose to boast, I would not be a fool, because I would be speaking the truth. But I refrain, so no one will think more of me than is warranted by what I do or say. ⁷ To keep me from becoming conceited because of these surpassingly great revelations, there was given me a thorn in my flesh, a messenger of Satan, to torment me. ⁸ Three times I pleaded with the Lord to take it away from me. ⁹ But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me. ¹⁰ That is why, for Christ's sake, I delight in weaknesses, in insults, in hardships, in persecutions, in difficulties. For when I am weak, then I am strong.

Sermon Notes

Sermon "Carrying Only a Staff"

Scriptures Mark 6:1-13, 2 Corinthians 12:2-10

Jesus

- Involved in his public ministry - teaching, miracles of healing
- Traveled to Nazareth, which happens to be his hometown
- Went there to teach and further train his disciples - an example of what they will encounter
- On the Sabbath, he was teaching in the synagogue - listeners were amazed
- People were asking questions - they were unable to comprehend how the carpenter's son could be the one before them - "and they took offense at him."
 - * Could not understand from where Jesus received his knowledge, they were concerned with the source of his teaching
 - * Offense - offended and repelled, abandoning
- A prophet without honor - among his relatives and home town
 - * Incapable of appreciating Jesus because they identified him with themselves so closely
- Could not do any miracles, except to lay his hands on a few sick people - lack of faith
- Left amazed at their lack of faith - account of his birth, the account of his presence at the temple at the age of twelve, the teachings of John, all forgotten

Disciples

- Jesus sent out the twelve, two by two (Deuteronomy 17:6) (fishers of men)
- Take nothing but a staff
- Wear sandals, but no extra tunic
- Stay in just one house in each town
- If refused a place, shake the dust off your feet
- Went out and preached repentance, driving out demons and anointed the sick (Mark 1:15)

Reflections

- Think of the last time you were amazed by the teaching of Jesus - what caused the amazement?
- Through reading the gospels, believers are prepared to be sent out - is that the case?
- 2 Corinthians 12:9 - "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." - do we rely enough on God's grace? Do we trust God's grace? Do we scorn God's grace?
