Pastor's Column

I was very pleased and impressed with the curriculum used in this year's week of Vacation Bible School. The application of the five Bible stories flowed together very well through the week. Sunday's story of Daniel and The Lion's Den focused on faith. Monday's story about Queen Esther focused on boldness of faith. Tuesday's story of the Parable of the Good Samaritan focused on kindness in aiding our neighbors. Wednesday's account of the Healing of the 10 Lepers focused on thankfulness. Thursday's story of On the Road to Emmaus focused on hope, the hope we have in Christ Jesus.

Simple backdrops set the stage for each of the stories, and the material suggested simple ways to tell each story in a new way each night – getting the children involved in the story so they didn't just sit and listen, but participated. Follow up application questions and a simple activity served to reinforce the lesson focus. Each succeeding lesson built on the previous lessons, tying everything together through the week's memory vector verse of Ephesians 3:20 – “Glory to God, who is able to do far beyond all that we could ask or imagine by his power at work with in us.”

From now until September 12th, I will spend the majority of my time focusing on relaunching our ministries as we renew our efforts in giving all glory to God as a Christian congregation. There are many action steps to accomplish in order to successfully relaunch our Sunday morning, Wednesday evening, and monthly schedule of ministries. I am trusting the promise of the vector verse, knowing that with God at work within us, all will come together for his glory.

Please join me in praying for God's will to be accomplished, and praying for God to reveal his plans for us. Pray for faithful boldness on the part of our congregation as the work of recruiting and equipping leaders is of utmost importance. I'm praying for the blessing of Ephesians 4:11-13 to be lived out in the work of relaunching: “It was he who gave some to be apostles, some to be prophets, some to be evangelists, and some to be pastors and teachers,¹² to prepare God's people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up¹³ until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ.”

I am praying for God's wisdom in the work of preparing people of the congregation for the works of service before us. Who do I call to help with Faith Village or Logos? Who do I call to help with leading JYF and SYF? Who do I call to help teach Sunday school classes or small groups? Who do I call to serve in our Stephen Ministry program? I request your prayers for God's wisdom and your prayers for clear revelation of whom to call. I request your prayers for people to faithfully consider and respond to calls of recruitment. I request your prayers for the active work of the Holy Spirit as God's power works within us in “attaining the whole measure of the fullness of Christ.”

“Back Bay Mission has a simple mission: to strengthen neighborhoods, seek justice, and transform lives.

We strengthen neighborhoods through ministries like our education and empowerment programs and our housing rehabilitation program. These vital ministries help the people we serve be a part of, and build, their communities on the Mississippi Gulf Coast. As volunteers take what they learn at Back Bay Mission home with them, they have the opportunity to strengthen their own neighborhoods. We seek justice by helping the people we serve become more involved in their communities, educating people about the realities of poverty, and advocating on behalf of marginalized people in our community. All of our programs transform lives. Whether we’re helping a homeowner keep their home, mentoring a single mother as she plans her path out of poverty, or working with an intern who is thinking about a career in social work, we’re making the lives of the people we serve better” (thebackbaymission.org, 2021).

2022 Trip to Biloxi, Mississippi to Serve with Back Bay Mission (BBM)

We are back on the calendar for Back Bay Mission’s volunteer work program. This Saturday to Saturday experience is scheduled for March 6-12, 2022. The week focuses on fellowship and service in building hope and faith for all involved. BBM serves the needs of the homeless, the needs of people living in poverty, and the needs of people surviving in low income realities. God’s word of prophecy from Micah 6:8 undergirds the entire week’s experience – “And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly, to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God.”

Toledo Gospel Rescue Mission

As part of their ministry, TGRM operates a men’s shelter in which they provide night-to-night shelter for homeless men who are over eighteen years of age. Men desiring to stay in the shelter must be sober and cooperative and in by 6:00PM. Each night they receive a message of hope in a chapel service, eat a nutritious balanced meal, shower, and sleep in a clean, warm bed. In the morning, they eat a solid breakfast before they leave. Also offered is the Work Skills Program under which selected men receive life skills training, work ethics training, and work therapy. Men involved in this program also have midday devotions offered to them throughout the week in conjunction with their lunch.

St. John’s provides the Sunday evening chapel service and meal four times a year – the next opportunity is scheduled for September 12th. It’s best to have six to eight volunteers share in the service and meal. Anyone with interest or questions should talk with Dale or Ann Grime.


