Scripture Readings

Exodus 3:9-14 And now the cry of the Israelites has reached me, and I have seen the way the Egyptians are oppressing them. ¹⁰ So now, go. I am sending you to Pharaoh to bring my people the Israelites out of Egypt." ¹¹ But Moses said to God, "Who am I, that I should go to Pharaoh and bring the Israelites out of Egypt?" ¹² And God said, "I will be with you. And this will be the sign to you that it is I who have sent you: When you have brought the people out of Egypt, you will worship God on this mountain." ¹³ Moses said to God, "Suppose I go to the Israelites and say to them, 'The God of your fathers has sent me to you,' and they ask me, 'What is his name?' Then what shall I tell them?" ¹⁴ God said to Moses, "I AM WHO I AM. This is what you are to say to the Israelites: 'I AM has sent me to you.'"

Psalm 25:1-5 To you, O Lord, I lift up my soul; ² in you I trust, O my God. Do not let me be put to shame, nor let my enemies triumph over me. ³ No one whose hope is in you will ever be put to shame, but they will be put to shame who are treacherous without excuse. ⁴ Show me your ways, O Lord, teach me your paths; ⁵ guide me in your truth and teach me, for you are God my Savior, and my hope is in you all day long.

Romans 14:9-12 For this very reason, Christ died and returned to life so that he might be the Lord of both the dead and the living. ¹⁰ You, then, why do you judge your brother? Or why do you look down on your brother? For we will all stand before God's judgment seat. ¹¹ It is written: "'As surely as I live,' says the Lord, 'every knee will bow before me; every tongue will confess to God." ¹² So then,

each of us will give an account of himself to God.

Romans 1:16-17 I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God for the salvation of everyone who believes: first for the Jew, then for the Gentile. ¹⁷ For in the gospel a righteousness from God is revealed, a righteousness that is by faith from first to last, just as it is written: "The righteous will live by faith."

Hebrews 11:1-3 Now faith is being sure of what we hope for and certain of what we do not see. ² This is what the ancients were commended for. ³ By faith we understand that the universe was formed at God's command, so that what is seen was not made out of what was visible.

Matthew 17:14-20 When they came to the crowd, a man approached Jesus and knelt before him. 15 "Lord, have mercy on my son," he said. "He has seizures and is suffering greatly. He often falls into the fire or into the water. ¹⁶ I brought him to your disciples, but they could not heal him." 17 "O unbelieving and perverse generation," Jesus replied, "how long shall I stay with you? How long shall I put up with you? Bring the boy here to me." ¹⁸ Jesus rebuked the demon, and it came out of the boy, and he was healed from that moment. ¹⁹ Then the disciples came to Jesus in private and asked, "Why couldn't we drive it out?" ²⁰ He replied, "Because you have so little faith. I tell you the truth, if you have faith as small as a mustard seed, you can say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there' and it will move. Nothing will be impossible for you."

Confirmation Class Creed

As an expression of our growing knowledge about God and the Christian Church, we share the following statement of our beliefs:

We believe that there is one God alone, the Triune God of Father, Son and Holy Spirit, who is known to us as the "Great I Am," the "Good Shepherd," the "Suffering Servant," the "Mediator" and the "King of Kings and Lord of Lords." God's powers and love are so great and supreme that they surpass all of our understanding.

We know that with God we are never alone, for we believe that his love is everywhere and that he will always love us, for we know God's and Jesus' love are unconditional. We know of God's love for us through the death of Jesus on the cross, dying for our sins as he conquered death, so that if we believe in him, death shall not conquer us. We know that Jesus gave up his life so that we could live ours worry free. As all humans are imperfect and sinful, we believe in the need for salvation through Christ as we come to him and ask for forgiveness of our sins. We know that someday in God's time, Jesus will come back for all who believe and take them to his kingdom in heaven where all will be made new and perfect according to the will of the Lord.

We also believe that in a way, the Christian church, as the Body of Christ, is the current establishment of God's kingdom here on earth. For us, the church symbolizes shelter and sanctuary for believers to come together and worship God in peace. The church's mission is to spread the word of Christ, and we cannot be ashamed of the gospel, but must share the gospel with others. The church must have its armor on, to fight for souls, and to have the desire to follow Christ instead of the world.
