Pastor's Column

I regularly turn to the historical archives of St. John's and read from past directories of the congregation. The Centennial Souvenir edition reveals that in the months of September and October in 1952, the St. John's Evangelical and Reformed Church marked its 100th anniversary with special services of worship over the course of four consecutive Sundays. On Sunday, September 14, 1952, Pastor T.J. Klaudt preached from Ephesians 2, with the title of the sermon being "The Source of Life's Inseparable Ties."

As I read Ephesians 2 today, I wonder if the central tie Pastor Klaudt spoke on was from verse 13, "But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far away have been brought near through the blood of Christ." Brought near – near to God, and near to one another. Such a theme is what SJCC is about once again – drawing near to God and to one another. This is the focus of B.L.A.S.T. Sunday, September 12th! To begin anew, to worship and praise God who is faithful, and to rekindle connections as a congregation and community of faith.

On the final page of the 1952 Centennial Souvenir, one reads "The Future":

The past has been glorious. The future also belongs to us if we make use of the propitious present.

So today let us build, thinking that we build forever. Let it not be for present delight or for present use alone. Let us so labor and give ourselves to St. John's Church that the future will turn to be a sacred possession for our children because our hands and hearts have been busy today. (emphasis added)

And, perchance, as our children and children's children look upon the labor of hand and heart here they will say:

"See! This our fathers did for us."

I encourage you to dwell upon these words, especially the sentence I've italicized. Over the course of the coming month, I am praying for busy hands and hearts as we build towards the future, a future of glory to God as we continue to be "The Church on the Corner Whose Cornerstone is Christ."

We are tied together through the grace and love of Jesus Christ, and I pray our unity will continue to bind us together as we live out Paul's words in Philippians 3:13-14: "Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead, I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus." I pray that God's grace enables us each to forget the past months of pandemic, protocols, separation and discord, as we strain towards the glory of the Lord.

Consistory

Highlights of the August 16, 2021 Consistory Meeting:

Special Presentation – Facility Committee – Jeff Rutledge

- 1. Jeff Rutledge, chairperson of the Facility Committee, presented the committee's recommendations to improve restrooms, worship experience, and accessibility
- 2. The current scope of the project with G5 Architecture is \$6,637.19 over the \$20,000 budget. The committee was unaware that revisions to the initial and subsequent floor plans exceeded the budget and Jeff will express their surprise at the overage with G5.
- 3. Erich Christman outlined steps and dates that can be followed in order to move forward using the information presented by the Facility Committee.

Committee Reports

- 1. Second Mile Fund Capital History Second Mile Fund Balance in 2004 \$260,880 (invested with Edward Jones); Second Mile Fund Balance in 2015 \$362,036 (invested with EGR); Second Mile Fund Balance as of 7/31/21 \$513,144 (invested with EGR); Each year, \$6,000 has been pulled out per Second Mile policy towards the annual Mission Budget; 7/31/21 Balance Less 2004 Balance \$513,144 \$260,880 = \$252,264. We are checking with EGR regarding any donations made to the Second Mile Fund that would be considered principle.
- 2. Evangelism Committee Todd Nafziger
 - A. Book Bag Bash distributed 45 bags out of the 100 that had been packed; an email was sent to the school principals letting them know we have extra book bags and supplies. Five book bags were dropped off to the elementary office the other schools will let us know if they need any book bags. Erich Christman reported that an additional 20 bags were handed out after the event.

Consistory (cont.)

- B. A movie night for the community, possibly in September/October, is being discussed.
- C. October raking leaves in the surrounding neighborhood as an outreach
- 3. Fellowship Committee Jon Lindsay
 - A. BLAST Sept 12 meal has been planned with Chicken from Port-a-Pit; committee is in need of help with set up, as well as, additional help on the day of the meal
- 4. Property Committee Tim Beck
 - A. Continuing to look for a part time maintenance person; parking lot repairs the lot is much better condition, in terms of cracks and levelness, than it was previously
- 5. Search Committee David Stuckey
 - A. The committee put together a description of the church for the candidates. The committee put together an advertisement to be posted. The hope is to post the advertisement by Monday 8/23/21 in various places.
- 6. Spiritual Council Erich Christman
 - A. Presentation Sunday was a blessing. One confirmand has chosen to postpone being baptized, so the confirmand will not be confirmed at this time.

Pastor's Report – Erich Christman

- 1. Covid-19 Current Status Implications/Plan Continue to receive updates from the various sources no mandates at this time; relaunch of the new program year is status quo at this time
- 2. Christian Preschool \$2400 pandemic payment has not yet been received; the preschool has been officially closed according to the state of Ohio.
- 3. Live Stream Lighting ACT/Purchase Own looking to possibly purchase 2 spotlights of our own. Cost will be approximately \$4500. We will need to return the borrowed spotlights to ACT at some point. In the coming weeks, the spotlights will be turned off during the Live Stream so a comparison can be made spotlights vs. no spotlights

Old Business Items – Gary Frazier

- 1. South Property Task Force based on recent discussions, Erich Christman suggests that a task force be formed to put together possible plans for the south property.
- 2. DQ Interest in Land Gary Frazier DQ is interested in purchasing the 19 foot wide strip of land along the north border of their property. DQ owner's counteroffer is \$15,000 plus all associated closing fees/costs. Original offer was to be \$22,500, but \$25,000 was mistakenly offered instead. Gary Frazier will call DQ to explain that the offer was supposed to be \$22,500, possibly reopening negotiations. Motion was approved to accept the \$15,000 or anything above plus closing costs.

Committees

2019 Facility Committee

The Facility Committee began meeting in May of 2019, working towards a solution in three specific facility areas of the church building – restrooms, accessibility and the sanctuary. After many meetings and working with G5 Architecture, the committee presented the results of their work to the Consistory on August 16th. The Consistory will spend the next month studying the presented solution and proposed cost estimates as they prepare for discussion of the material at the September 20th meeting.

Having shared the results of their efforts, the Facility Committee has completed their work, unless the Consistory has further work for them after their review.

We want to express our gratitude to the members of the Facility Committee – Jeff Rutledge (Chair), Eric Nafziger (Vice-Chair), Maggie Enderle, Jeremy Hurst, Mike Meyer, Paige Miller, Doug Rupp, Dean Sauder and Pastor Erich.

Search Committee for the Pastor of Music and Worship

The committee has finished updating the church's profile, which describes the theology, history, ministry and dynamics of the congregation. This profile information and the position job description is available on our church website, under the search committee tab.

The committee has posted the position on two church staffing websites, sent the information to the Evangelical Association, and shared the position information with some seminaries. Now we await resumes from interested candidates.
