We have had to limit and even stop visitation which was difficult for everyone. We are pleased that visitation is open again and no appointments are necessary. We try to limit visitors to 2 at a time, but guests are welcome anytime between 9am and 7pm everyday.

Now that we are able to easily welcome guests we are also anxious to restart our Volunteer Program.

Fairlawn needs your help more than ever before. Our staff have worked so hard over the past 2 years without the support of our volunteers and we are all excited to welcome people back. As a volunteer you can help weekly, monthly or on a project by project basis.
