SCRIPTURE READINGS

Deuteronomy 30:11-16 ¹¹Now what I am commanding you today is not too difficult for you or beyond your reach. ¹²It is not up in heaven, so that you have to ask, "Who will ascend into heaven to get it and proclaim it to us so we may obey it?" ¹³Nor is it beyond the sea, so that you have to ask, "Who will cross the sea to get it and proclaim it to us so we may obey it?" ¹⁴No, the word is very near you; it is in your mouth and in your heart so you may obey it. ¹⁵See, I set before you today life and prosperity, death and destruction. ¹⁶For I command you today to love the Lord your God, to walk in his ways, and to keep his commands, decrees and laws; then you will live and increase, and the Lord your God will bless you in the land you are entering to possess.

Colossians 1:9-14 ⁹For this reason, since the day we heard about you, we have not stopped praying for you and asking God to fill you with the knowledge of his will through all spiritual wisdom and understanding. ¹⁰And we pray this in order that you may live a life worthy of the Lord and may please him in every way: bearing fruit in every good work, growing in the knowledge of God, ¹¹being strengthened with all power according to his glorious might so that you may have great endurance and patience, and joyfully ¹²giving thanks to the Father, who has qualified you to share in the inheritance of the saints in the kingdom of light. ¹³For he has rescued us from the dominion of darkness and brought us into the kingdom of the Son he loves, ¹⁴in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.

Sermon - "Be a Fruit Inspector"

Scripture - Colossians 1:9-14

Lesson focus: At a recent Bible study session, a person shared that they heard a Christian describing herself as a "fruit inspector."

- A. Inspecting the fruit of a Christian: Colossians 1:10 - "bearing fruit in every good work" - to know a person by their fruit

- B. Court of Law - judging on bad behavior - yet appearance seems to matter
- C. County Fair - picking out the best

- D. Jesus has much to say about judging a person
 - 1. Matthew 7:1-2 "Do not judge, or you too will be judged. ²For in the same way you judge others, you will be judged, and with the measure you use, it will be measured to you."
 - 2. John 7:24 "Stop judging by mere appearances, and make a right judgment. Passing judgement on someone based solely on appearances is sinful."
 - 3. Luke 6:37 "Do not judge, and you will not be judged. Do not condemn, and you will not be condemned. Forgive, and you will be forgiven."
 - 4. Luke 7:36-50 - Jesus rebukes Simon, who passed judgment on a woman based on her reputation.
