# PASTOR'S COLUMN

I want to share with you some of the priorities of ministry I am currently seeking to address. I share this information for your awareness, your potential involvement, and to prompt your prayers.

I trust that it's obvious that the pandemic both interrupted and slowed down our congregational ministries, as well as my pastoral ministry to the congregation. While we were able to restart many of our ministries last fall, participation and volunteerism still lagged behind previous norms. The calling of Pastor Ryan as Pastor of Music and Worship is enabling me to focus more on ministry leadership and pastoral ministry, for which I am thankful and grateful. While Pastor Ryan and I continue to discuss, discern and plan our music and worship ministries, I am focusing on the following short term priorities:

# Priority #1 – Pastoral Visits

Following Pentecost Sunday, I began to serve communion to our members living in care facilities and over the next few weeks I plan to serve our members who are homebound or who have let me know they are unable to attend Sunday morning worship.

Following the communion visits, I plan to begin visiting with members who are over 90 years of age, and then those members who are over 80, and then those members who are over 70.

#### Priority #2 – Youth Ministry

The Consistory has seen some initial plans and a job description for staffing the youth ministries of our congregation. Could we have a full-time or part-time youth pastor? Could we have a part-time youth coordinator? Answers to such questions will be forthcoming. I do know that we will continue to rely upon having lay leaders involved in our youth ministries. We need to have a viable and vibrant plan by Rally Sunday, August 21st.

#### Priority #3 – Christian Education Ministries

I've tried to fully staff the Christian Education Team, but still lack a few members, so recruiting of volunteers for the team is the first step. Once the Christian Education Team is staffed, they'll need to meet and plan for the coming program year of ministry.

One of the key aspects of the Logos ministry is the involvement of parents. I would like to take that approach for all of our Christian Education ministries – Sunday school, Faith Village, Logos, JYF, SYF and Life Planning. I'd like to have a meeting, or two, of all parents of our children and youth. We need to focus on goals of our ministries, participation in our ministries, and parental involvement in our ministries.

As we plan for the next program year, we have much to accomplish as we seek to grow in our knowledge of God.

  - b. Matt explained the SEI portfolio passed out to members
    - i. Fighting inflation; interest rates; bonds: we probably have not seen the bottom of the drop yet
    - ii. Last stock market drop was when COVID hit a quick drop
    - iii. Activity of investment gains; however, loss from end of 2021
    - iv. Reviewed strategy breakdown according to church's Investment Policy Statement
    - v. EGR receives 0.5% in fees

# July Mission-A-Month Shepherd's Circle

Shepherd's Circle is a local mission project started by Cecily Rohrs in 2004. The purpose of this program is to mentor individuals or families who are good people that have made bad choices. Through this project, assistance is given and guidance is provided to help these people get back on their feet and once again become productive citizens and good stewards of their financial resources.



#### Habitat for Humanity, Fulton County, Ohio (HFHFCO)

The current home build is located at 908 Zenobia Street in Wauseon. The three bedroom, two full bath home will be the new home of the Castillo family, father, mother and two teenage daughters.

Status of the progress on the home:

- 1. All permits have been approved.
- 2. The excavation for the house and garage foundations has been completed.
- 3. The concrete foundation contractor hopes to have had his work completed by the end of June.
- 4. Material estimates and delivery schedules are being addressed

#### Next steps include:

- 1. Framing the unattached garage for storage space during the build
- 2. Installing the central beam of the house, then constructing the floor deck
- 3. Transporting the pre-framed walls from the SJCC storage building to the build site

Volunteers are needed to construct the garage, construct the floor deck of the home, then erect the walls and set the trusses of the home, and then go from there. Anyone interested in helping can contact Pastor Erich, the coordinator of this local home build.
