#### SCRIPTURE READINGS

**Revelation 15:3-4** – <sup>3</sup>And [they] sang the song of Moses the servant of God and the song of the Lamb: "Great and marvelous are your deeds, Lord God Almighty. Just and true are your ways, King of the ages. <sup>4</sup>Who will not fear you, O Lord, and bring glory to your name? For you alone are holy. All nations will come and worship before you, for your righteous acts have been revealed."

Acts 11:19-30 - 19Now those who had been scattered by the persecution in connection with Stephen traveled as far as Phoenicia, Cyprus and Antioch, telling the message only to Jews. <sup>20</sup>Some of them, however, men from Cyprus and Cyrene, went to Antioch and began to speak to Greeks also, telling them the good news about the Lord Jesus. <sup>21</sup>The Lord's hand was with them, and a great number of people believed and turned to the Lord. <sup>22</sup>News of this reached the ears of the church at Jerusalem, and they sent Barnabas to Antioch. <sup>23</sup>When he arrived and saw the evidence of the grace of God, he was glad and encouraged them all to remain true to the Lord with all their hearts. <sup>24</sup>He was a good man, full of the Holy Spirit and faith, and a great number of people were brought to the Lord. <sup>25</sup> Then Barnabas went to Tarsus to look for Saul, <sup>26</sup>and when he found him, he brought him to Antioch. So, for a whole year Barnabas and Saul met with the church and taught great numbers of people. The disciples were called Christians first at Antioch. <sup>27</sup>During this time some prophets came down from Jerusalem to Antioch. <sup>28</sup>One of them, named Agabus, stood up and through the Spirit predicted that a severe famine would spread over the entire Roman world. (This happened during the reign of Claudius.) <sup>29</sup>The disciples, each according to his ability, decided to provide help for the brothers living in Judea. <sup>30</sup>This they did, sending their gift to the elders by Barnabas and Saul.

Barnabas

- Acts 4:36-37 "Joseph, a Levite from Cyprus, whom the apostles called Barnabas (which means Son of Encouragement), <sup>37</sup> sold a field he owned and brought the money and put it at the apostles' feet."
- Acts 11:24 "He was a good man, full of the Holy Spirit and faith,..."
- A co-worker and supporter of Paul
- Generous enabled God's grace to be active amongst people
- Bridged the gap between the Jewish and Greek worlds
- Seen as someone who stayed in the background, not an "out front" type of person

Application

- Many people decry the state of the nation people turning from God, violence and hatred abounding, disunity is real, a focus on "me" is prevalent, a loss of freedom is occurring
- In the times of the early Church, persecution was rampant, for hatred towards the followers of Christ was widespread

#### **CHURCH CONSTITUTION SPOTLIGHT**

A church constitution is a legal document that gives the church direction in ministry and administrative structure. The constitution documents what a church is, what it does and why it does it. Parts of a constitution include: purpose statement, doctrinal statement, membership requirements, leadership roles and responsibilities, and procedural and legal issues. Church leaders are looking to highlight specific areas of the constitution as part of the annual nomination and election process, so here is the first Constitution Spotlight:

#### SECTION I - NAME AND OBJECT

Article 1.

The name of this congregation shall be St. John's Christian Church of Archbold, Ohio.

#### Article 2.

The object of this congregation shall be to provide its members with the stated preaching of the Word of God, the administration of the Sacraments, the facilities for public worship, and the exercise of Christian discipline; and to adopt and to carry out from time to time such measures as are in harmony with the spirit, teachings and customs of the Christian faith that shall promote the general interests of the Redeemer's Kingdom.
