SCRIPTURE READINGS

Selections from Psalms (90, 86, 119) – Lord, You have been our dwelling place in all generations. Teach us to number our days that we may get a heart of wisdom. Consider how I love Your precepts! Passage outline and notes:

¹² For the word of God is living and active. Sharper than any double-edged sword, it penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow; it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart.

- God's Word a reference to God's message to humans
- Our primary contact with God is through His written Word
- Living, Active, Penetrating, Discerning
- God's Word can reach to the innermost recesses of our being
- Everything about a person is open and known by God

- Uncovered and laid bare exposed, God sees all of our guilt
- We will give an account reason for heeding the exhortation




SEPTEMBER MISSION-A-MONTH: TOLEDO GOSPEL RESCUE MISSION
