SCRIPTURE READING

Psalm 47:1-2, 5-7 - Clap your hands, all you nations; shout to God with cries of joy. ² How awesome is the Lord Most High, the great King over all the earth! ⁵ God has ascended amid shouts of joy, the Lord amid the sounding of trumpets. ⁶ Sing praises to God, sing praises; sing praises to our King, sing praises. ⁷For God is the King of all the earth; sing to him a psalm of praise.

Acts 1:1-11 - In my former book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus began to do and to teach 2 until the day he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles he had chosen. ³ After his suffering, he showed himself to these men and gave many convincing proofs that he was alive. He appeared to them over a period of forty days and spoke about the kingdom of God. 4 On one occasion, while he was eating with them, he gave them this command: "Do not leave Jerusalem, but wait for the gift my Father promised, which you have heard me speak about. ⁵ For John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit." 6 So when they met together, they asked him, "Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?" ⁷ He said to them: "It is not for you to know the times or dates the Father has set by his own authority. 8 But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." 9 After he said this, he was taken up before their very eyes, and a cloud hid him from their sight. ¹⁰They were looking intently up into the sky as he was going, when suddenly two men dressed in white stood beside them. 11 "Men of Galilee," they said, "why do you stand here looking into the sky? This same Jesus, who has been taken from you into heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen him go into heaven."

SERMON NOTES: "WE'RE TO BE ON A MISSION"

Luke, the writer, was the author of the Gospel of Luke and the Book of Acts.

The Ending of his Gospel account – Luke 24:50-53 When he had led them out to the vicinity of Bethany, he lifted up his hands and blessed them. ⁵¹ While he was blessing them, he left them and was taken up into heaven. ⁵² Then they worshiped him and returned to Jerusalem with great joy. ⁵³ And they stayed continually at the temple, praising God.

The Beginning of his History account – Acts 1:1-2 In my former book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus began to do and to teach ² until the day he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles he had chosen.

Acts 1:1-11 details the period of Jesus' resurrection days on earth

- Giving instruction through the Holy Spirit to the apostles
- Showed himself, gave many convincing proofs he was alive
- Spoke about the kingdom of God
- Commanded them to stay in Jerusalem and wait
- Spoke of Israel's restoration, the coming of the Holy Spirit, and being witnesses

Focus in on Acts 1:11 - "Why do you stand here looking in the sky?"

- Jesus had just been taken up before their very eyes
- They'd just lost sight of Jesus in the clouds
- They were looking intently up into the sky
- Suddenly, two men appeared and asked the question

Was it a moment's hesitation? Wasn't it a natural act of awe and wonder?

The question serves as a call to action

Luke 24:52 – "Then they worshipped him and returned to Jerusalem with great joy." Their joy speaks to their knowledge that they knew Jesus was with them forever.

Important note on Acts 1:11 – the promise of the Second Coming – "This same Jesus, who has been taken from you into heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen him go into heaven."
