# PASTOR'S COLUMN

Consider the meaning and direction of the following two verses of scripture:

- First, the blessed verse of Psalm 118:24: "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it."
- Second, the blessed verse of Philippians 4:8: "Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable if anything is excellent or praiseworthy think about such things."

I believe my enjoyment of each of the four seasons of the year is based on these two verses. God's work informs and instructs us to live each day with a positive attitude. I recognize that one of my faults is to over compensate for people's negative attitude toward the weather. As people decry the stifling heat and humidity of summer or the frigid cold of winter, I realize I often overstate my joy of each season. There is nothing we can do about the weather – Bible verses abound that speak to God's sovereignty over the rain and the hail, over the wind and the lightning. From the instruction of scripture, my mother's positive influence, and my years involved in outdoor ministry, I thoroughly enjoy nature and the changing of the seasons. Each season offers its own blessings, and its own hurdles, which God causes us to deal with and live through.

Autumn is a season that causes me to go through an annual time of reflection in which I mentally travel back in time and recall the days of yesteryear. There is something about the timelessness of the season, how the many aspects of fall annually unfold that somehow trigger my mental reflections. Oh, the amazing meta-morphoses that are a part of the season: the changing of the leaves, the dropping of the ears of corn on the shriveling corn stalks, the cascading nature of leaves falling from the trees, and the falling of acorns, walnuts and hickory nuts that provide winter's food for so many of nature's critters.

Rejoicing and gladness, worship and praise, right and pure – positive reflections of thinking about such things undergirds my enjoyment of life and my delight in all the days God has ordained (Psalm 139:16).

The love of God and a positive attitude of life blesses each day with joy and fortitude, leaving us with much to be thankful for as we worship and praise Glorious and Mighty God.

#### Community Kickoff Meeting - LifeWise Academy November 1st, 7:00PM @ St. John's Christian Church

LifeWise Academy is a program meant to positively impact students, schools and communities by providing a Bible-based, character-focused Released Time Religious Education (RTRE) program. RTRE is a legal program by which religious education is accessible to public school students during the school day allowing them to leave school (with parental permission) to attend off-site classes which are both academic and religious in nature. The program is 1) privately funded, 2) held off of school property, and 3) includes only students with parental permission. This initial community informational meeting will address "The Why, The What & The How of LifeWise."

## CONSISTORY

#### **2023 Nomination Ballot**

The Spiritual Council, which serves as the Nominating Committee of the congregation, has begun the annual task of working to complete the ballot for the election of officers at the congregation's annual meeting. Our Church Constitution includes the following directive: "Two or more nominees for each office of Elder and Deacon shall be presented by the Consistory, and one or more nominees for each office of congregational President and Congregational Secretary shall also be presented." Each year, we elect people to fill two Elder offices and three Deacon/Deaconess offices, so we should have four nominees for the office of Elder and six nominees for the office of Deacon/Deaconess.

The Spiritual Council invites the congregation to be in prayer for potential nominees, asking for God's Spirit to touch the hearts of members who would be led to volunteer to put their name on the ballot and, if elected, then serve in one of these offices.

Anyone who feels so led may speak with one of the current elders (Ryan Christman, Norm Fether, Jon Lindsay, Betsy Redd, David Stuckey, Nici Wyse). The Church Constitution shares that "Additional nominations may be made from the floor. All nominees must give prior consent." So may we pray for willing nominees and if you feel led to serve or have someone to nominate, the Spiritual Council invites your involvement.



#### **Church Safety and Security**

The Consistory is in the process of establishing a safety and security plan for all aspects of our ministries, including such areas as risk assessment and management, building security, an emergency response plan, financial security protection and safety training. To begin the process, church leaders are seeking interested people to help with this plan – is there anyone in the congregation that has such experience from their work career? If you, or you know of someone from the church of community who we could use as a resource, please let the church office know.

To date we have had one person volunteer to serve, so our search continues for a few more people who could help with this process.
