PASTORAL COLUMN

We've made it through the highlights of the church year: Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, and most recently, Pentecost. Now what? What do we teach and focus on until the next December rolls around again? I believe we now have an opportunity for the next six months to reflect and apply to our lives all that we have heard and experienced this year so far. What does it mean for us that the Father sent His Son? What does it mean for us that the Son suffered, died, rose, and ascended? What does it mean for us that the Holy Spirit dwells with us? How have our lives changed because of these truths? How should they change?

The book of James in the New Testament is a great place to find some hard-hitting application. You may have heard the saying, "Less talk and more action." This cultural phrase matches well with James. James' letter is about faith in action: "Be doers of the word and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves" (James 1:22). James took action by encouraging his poor brothers and sisters to suffer injustice in such a way that their steadfast faith would be an example to their oppressors (4:1-8). Violence doesn't bring about justice; loves does (1:19-20). James also encouraged those with means to care for those who were poor and distressed, namely, orphans and widows (1:27). To both groups, and to everyone in between, James explains that *true worship* is: (1) empowered by the Holy Spirit and the truths He reminds us of; (2) is not merely what we say we believe; but (3) in how we live that out by loving those around us.

May you be challenged by the truths that you heard these last six months – and now make them a reality in your own life. And just in case you need reminded once more: the Father loves you so much that He sent His most precious Son for you. The Son loves you so much that He suffered and died for your sins. The Holy Spirit loves you so much that he chooses to live and dwell with you always.

May these truths change your life forever,
