PASTORAL COLUMN

It has been six weeks since my total knee replacement surgery, and my recovery seems to be tracking as expected, according to the surgeon and the physical therapists. I am very grateful for the prayers of the congregation and the cards of encouragement many of you sent me. What a blessing to be lifted up before the Lord in prayer!

While my back surgery in 2018 was much more extensive than this knee surgery, the follow up therapy work has been much, much harder for the knee. Therapy following back surgery revolved around exercises in the pool and walking. Therapy following knee surgery included more than a dozen strength and stretching exercises, a few of which were very painful, with one in particular being, dare I say, excruciating! Then the surgeon gave me new instructions in order to work on the straightening of my leg – sit in a chair, with your heel resting on another chair, ice your knee, and then put ten pounds of weight on top of the knee, three times a day for up to thirty minutes at a time. Aggressive treatment to get my leg muscles stretched like they haven't been stretched in a number of years!

The pain of recovery is something you have to work through, giving full attention to your recovery, while expecting full healing to come.

The effort and painfulness of recovery speaks to me about some reading I've been doing lately. I've been reading articles on how people read, interpret, and understand the Bible, or why people choose *not* to read the Bible at all. These articles are part of a greater study regarding the current state of the Christian Church and the level of church participation.

The Discovery Guide recently included this thought when considering a difficult Bible passage about war and death: "No one could claim the Bible is air-brushed or edited to give its readers a simplistic message or make everyone look good."

Evidently many people only read the Bible seeking to look good and feel good about themselves, reading only for hope and encouragement (please note the word "only"). When a difficult passage comes along, they skip that reading, not wanting to believe in a God that calls for child sacrifice (Genesis 22 and Abraham's willingness to sacrifice his son, Isaac) or allows severe harm to befall a person (Job 1 and Satan's test of Job's faith).

While there are countless passages of scripture that make for very pleasurable reading, there are also countless passages of scripture that are tedious, ugly, or difficult to understand. As Christians, we don't read the Bible just for our pleasure, but we read to grow in our faith, to know more about the Lord, and to know more of God's will and guidance for our lives. Often times we have to really work at reading passages of scripture, reading from Bible commentaries and dictionaries to fully grasp what God is revealing to us in the passage.

The difficulty of such Bible reading is something we have to work through, giving full attention to our spiritual growth, while expecting our growth in faith to come. When reading the Bible is difficult, time consuming or painful to the mind, remember to persevere through in faithfully loving and honoring God, our heavenly Father.

COMMITTEES

Building Committee

The committee received the initial OPCC (Opinion of Probable Construction Costs) from Beilharz Architects at the end of May. The committee has met once to review the numbers and scope of the project and will meet again in mid-July. They are working with the project lead from Beilharz to fully understand the numbers and determine more information about materials and costs.

Once the committee reaches agreement on the OPCC, they plan to ask the Consistory to call a special congregational meeting for consideration of the OPCC.

The committee is currently awaiting reports from an electrician on a study of the electrical load of the building, as well as a lumen test in the Sanctuary. The electrical load test is to determine if we have enough capacity to supply power for the load demands included in the scope of the project. The lumen test is needed to guide the process of improving the level of lighting in the sanctuary.



Church Safety and Security Committee

This new committee has been formed for the purpose of creating a safety and security program for the church. The program will create a security plan that details what church leadership, the security team, and church members should do during an emergency.

The committee is beginning their work with a study of current safety policies of the church, as well as conducting a risk assessment of our facilities and ministries.

Eric Nafziger is serving as the committee chairperson, and serving on the committee are: Tim Beck, Kelly Ducey, Kasey Grime, Jeremy Kinsman, Betsy Redd, Jocelyn Walker, and Pastor Erich.



Search Committee

The Consistory is in the process of forming a search committee for filling the new staff position of Director/Minister/Pastor of Youth and Young Adults. Anyone interested in serving on this committee may talk with Nici Wyse or Pastor Erich. The intent is to have this committee formed by the end of July in order to begin their work in August.

CONSISTORY

Consistory Meeting Minutes – June 19, 2023

1. Financial Reports – Budget & Stewardship - Betsy Redd - \$40,000 is the maximum we are to have in checking, anything over should be transferred to EGR. Financials approved.
2. Committee Reports
 - a. Building Committee - Darlene Steiner - 2 meetings, architect brought a 7 page detailed opinion of probable construction costs. Electrical service entrance is being tested. Radiant heating system – there is a plan in place to take care of any leaks and loops that have been cut off or will be cut off. With restrooms being moved, that heating in the floor will be abandoned. There are 31 heating loops under the sanctuary floor.
 - b. Fellowship Committee - Steve Walker - May 28th hosted the youth breakfast. 35 attendees. Went very well, approved by the youth. Thank you to all the committee members who helped out. Pam Reeb, Judy Sears, Jen Hurst took care of so much! Sometime in July or early August the committee will meet again to discuss the September 10th Burger Bash.
 - c. Mission Committee - Nancy Rupp - Committee voted to match funding for this year's VBS. A nice check will be sent to Kajiado Children's Home. A Zoom call with Zach Dye, with FCA in Cincinnati, a Bryan HS Grad. Zack is funded for the current year, but is seeking funding for next year. Fish Pantry has hired Jennifer Martin, starting date in September. Her focus will be on helping people with financing and budgeting. Rachel Jones will be the program director for LifeWise. Program will be held at Archbold Evan Church.
 - d. Personnel Committee - Jon Lindsay - 3 interested parties for the part-time custodial position. Only one followed through, which was Buffy Riley, and her friend Amanda Wolf. They will cover for each other in case of illness and vacations. Both have had commercial cleaning experience in the past. Since Buffy has working knowledge of the church - she had a plan for set ups too. They have been given the responsibilities and had a church walk-through. They started the week of June 12th to do the 12.5 hours weekly part of the custodial work. Advanced Cleaning sent a quote of \$38,000 for a yearly cost to do all of the church cleaning. That was higher than the expectation of \$24,000-\$26,000. The proposal for right now is to continue with ACC as in the past, with Buffy and Amanda cleaning until the end of July, with a reassessment at that time.
 - e. Property Committee - Matt Hines - Hill Asphalt said the parking lot does not need to be sealed this year, which was verified with an expert opinion shared with the committee. Funds could possibly go to landscaping and/or more landscape border bricks around the church. Andrew, part-time maintenance, has been attending the monthly meetings. This past month he discussed minor projects that he's working on (cable, wiring, minor outside manicuring). He is making a tremendous impact with committee members.
 - f. Spiritual Council - Pastor Erich's medical leave has mostly wrapped up. Cecily Rohrs will be here on July 9th to speak about Shepherd Circle. July 23rd is Communion, and the Suon's will be here to talk about starting their mission work in Mexico.
 - g. Other Committee Reports - Evangelism - Jill Nafziger - Working to sponsor a day at the swimming pool, July 14th, information will be given out about the BBB (Book Bag Bash) as well as treats given to youth. Working on the Book Bag Bash currently, which will be held on August 6th.
3. Pastors Report - Erich Christman – Will finish therapy this week, follow up with his surgeon tomorrow. Daily routine will be back to pre-surgery levels starting June 26th. Summer mission trip has been canceled, due to funding with LaPorte Habitat for Humanity. July 9th, Amy Christman, directs a church camp in southern Indiana, and Pastor Erich will be a counselor. Pastor Erich will be on vacation July 28th, for 3 days. He officiated at four funerals during the past month. LifeWise is in the funding phase, planning to start at Archbold grades

K-4 in the fall. NCD (National Church Development) Survey Action Plan. Work at forming a church health team, people who want to see SJCC grow, leadership, or members of committees. Begin focusing on our biggest growth area, Holistic Small Groups to form relationships and growth.

4. New Business Items - Pastor Erich – Search Committee for Pastor of Youth and Young Adult – seeking 8-10 members for this committee. A list of names was shared by Consistory members. Pastor Erich will get with Nici Wyse and populate a group for this committee.

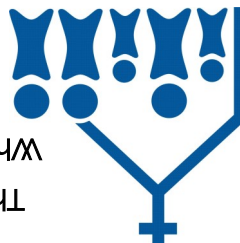
