PASTORAL COLUMN

In a recent sermon, I mentioned a game I played at a fellowship gathering, but I didn't share the name of the game because I couldn't remember what the game was called! The game is "Blank Slate: the game where _____ minds think alike!" The game is further described as "a game of addicting predictions! How well can you put your finger on what everyone's thinking?" To play, one person picks a word cue card and all players write the word you think best completes the phrase. You then try to match it to another player's word without giving a single hint. The game is easy to learn, quick to play, and fun for everyone; just grab a slate, write a word, and get ready to make a match. For example, the word cue card might have "Sand" on it and you could write down "castle" or "box" or "storm." If you wrote "castle," as in sand castle, and one other person had the same word on their card, you each would earn 3 points. If more than one person had the same word as you did, say three or four people had "castle," then each person earned 1 point. It was a humorous and quick-moving game to play.

So...here are some Church "Blank Slate" word cue cards...how would you complete the phrase?

Disciple... Fellow... Small...

Would you match my phrases? Disciple ship, Fellow ship, and Small groups? These are the key phrases I've been dwelling on for a few weeks now as I prepare for the new program year. Further thought about these words appears elsewhere in this issue of the Visitor.

Discipleship and fellowship were such key components of the Christian faith in the early church. Luke writes of these qualities in the Book of Acts and Paul encourages Christians to be attentive to these qualities throughout his letters. Working through an assessment of our congregational ministries has helped me gain a fresh perspective of discernment for a greater and deeper sense of Christian relationship, both with the Lord and with one another.

Please join me in praying each day for:

- ◆ God's direction and inspiration in planning, promoting, and recruiting.
- ◆ Focused discernment in selecting curriculum resources for existing and new ministries.
- ◆ The necessary volunteer leaders and teachers to support our many ministries.
- ◆ A fresh desire for us to spiritually grow and deepen our service to the Lord.

2023-2024 MINISTRY YEAR: DISCIPLESHIP & FELLOWSHIP

September 10th is Rally Sunday, the day SJCC kicks off a new year of ministry!

Throughout the coming ministry year, we will be intentionally focusing on one of eight quality characteristics used by God to build His church. This is based on results from a recent church assessment of our congregational ministries.

Holistic Small Groups is the quality characteristic of focus for the coming year. It is in such groups that Christians can find community and foster relationship, as well as spiritual interaction and support. Fellowship and discipleship is of utmost importance in the health and vitality of a congregation. We will be intentionally forming small group ministries for people of all ages, utilizing existing ministries within the mix of small group ministries.

“Discipleship and Fellowship” defines the program focus for 2023-2024. Jesus modeled discipleship and fellowship for the twelve disciples, as well as throughout his encounters with people. Discipleship and fellowship are themes of these two key passage of scripture:

“They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer.” Acts 2:42

“God, who has called you into fellowship with his Son Jesus Christ our Lord, is faithful.”
 1 Corinthians 1:9

Holistic Small Groups will include existing ministries, such as Sunday school classes, youth fellowships, weekly and monthly gatherings – all avenues of discipleship and fellowship:

MINISTRY CORNER

Worship Greeter Ministry

Greeters engage in Christian ministry as they welcome and offer friendliness to all who enter the church to worship God. Through greeting and welcoming people, our congregation practices the love that Jesus teaches us to share. Greeters welcome people to our Sunday morning worship services and activities in a spirit that makes them feel glad to be here. This is the beginning of fellowship and relationship.

We are looking to create a team of greeters to be in place at two of our main building entrances for each service of worship. Hopefully we can have a team of greeters which can serve once a month or once every two months.

Adult Ministries

As part of our “Discipleship and Fellowship” ministries, we are looking to form one or two teams of ministry leaders to coordinate ministries for adults. We could have one team to coordinate ministries for all adults, or we could form two teams – one for ministries for women and one for ministries for men. Hopes for these ministries include coordinating ministries and events like...

- ◆ Small group ministries
- ◆ Meal ministries – progressive meals, monthly gatherings, potlucks
- ◆ Quarterly event – special programs and meals
- ◆ Occasional one day or two day trips (i.e. Creation Museum, Stations of the Cross)
- ◆ Annual one day or two day retreats
- ◆ Annual national conferences (i.e. Women of Faith and Promise Keepers)

We would like to have four to five people per team, working with Pastor Erich and Jocelyn Walker, to launch and oversee these ministry events for the coming year.

Christian Education Committee

Consistory Meeting Minutes – July 17, 2023

Committees:

- a. Church Safety & Security Committee - Eric Nafziger
 The group has met to begin to organize. They started to review some of the policies that are already in place. The group is also reviewing existing documentation from our insurance company, etc. Betsy Redd, Jocelyn Walker, Tim Beck, Jeremy Kinsman, Kelly Ducey, Casey Grime.
- b. Evangelism Committee - Stacy Rutledge
 The committee sponsored a day at the community pool. It was a great day handing out snacks and invite cards for the BBB. Preparations are starting for the BBB (8/6/2023).
- c. Fellowship Committee - Steve Walker
 In the next couple of weeks, the group will be getting together to plan for this year's outdoor event (9/10/2023) – the "BBFF" (Burgers, Brats, Fellowship & Fun)
- d. Property Committee - Matt Hines
 Richard Spiess has completed some minor projects around the building. Andrew Zagarella's maintenance schedule has been reviewed. He has been an active member of the property committee. The group will be working with Tim Beck for evaluating and potential cleaning of the carpet and pews (certain areas as needed). The roof will be reviewed soon. The Fireside Room is being evaluated for updates.
- e. Spiritual Council - Erich Christman
 Christian Education Committee Job Description - The desire is to have this committee be led by members of the church rather than Pastor Erich. There would be a Consistory representative serving as part of the team. Pastor Erich is seeking approval to continue with this new committee. Motion to accept, carried unanimously.

Pastor's Report:

- ♦ Building Project – Fundraising Efforts - By breaking up some of the projects and getting things started, the building team is hoping to spark more interest in fundraising to support further projects. More conversations will be taking place regarding future fundraising efforts.
- ♦ Church Discipleship, Fellowship and Relationships - Pastor Erich provided an overview of a documentation on fellowship and discipleship. This will need to be a priority for this next program year.
- ♦ Search Committee for Pastor of Youth and Young Adults - Nici Wyse reported that July 26th will be the first meeting for the newly formed committee. Pastor Erich has talked with another youth pastor who recently took a position upon completion of seminary. He has classmates that are looking for positions. The group would be interested in seeing these resumes. The group would also be open to making connections with other faith-based youth organizations. Shepherd's Circle would be another avenue for candidate searching.
- ♦ Custodial Transition/Work...Amanda Wolf and Buffy Riley have been sharing a 12.5 hour per week job. They are also recognizing other opportunities that could be added to the "to-do list". Setup and take-down duties are still being ironed out.
- ♦ Summer Lunch Program - NOCAC has been sponsoring free lunches throughout the area. They have been serving about 15-24 kids per day. This program is ending at the end of July. Local churches will be covering the remainder of the summer.

CONSISTORY (CONT.)

- ♦ Tuesday Community Meals...This has become a small group ministry for many SJCC volunteers. St. John's leads this ministry each year. Pastor Erich asked for approval and support for St. John's to continue to lead this ministry.
- ♦ LifeWise...Rachel Jones and Trey Smith presented the ministry to St John's in both services. The first year budget is approximately \$110,000 with half already raised. They are currently looking for volunteers to support the K-4 ministry. Our mission committee has budgeted \$5000 in support for the year.

Back Bay serves communities on the Mississippi Gulf Coast through ministries like their education and empowerment programs and their housing rehabilitation program - all with a goal of transforming lives. St. John's has participated in several mission projects in coordination with Back Bay Mission in Biloxi, Mississippi over the years and continues to be one of our larger mission partners.

Service Opportunity

There have been plenty of times in the past that a group of volunteers from SJCC performed work for a homeowner, such as replacing a roof, building a backyard shed, constructing a ramp or deck. The homeowner supplied the materials and the volunteers supplied the know-how and labor. Once completed the homeowner made a donation to the church for the group’s efforts.

We have some new opportunities along this same line. This time around, it’s replacing vinyl siding on a home. Anyone interested in helping can speak with Pastor Erich. The hope is to get started on one or two projects this summer or fall.

Fulton County Habitat for Humanity

You’ll be able to see Habitat for Humanity in action at the Fulton County Fair! Teams of volunteers will be painting and assembling six to eight play houses on the Saturday and Tuesday of the fair. The play houses are a fundraising effort of Habitat for Humanity of Fulton County, Ohio, with companies and groups sponsoring the play houses, which is then received by a family who has applied for one.

Growing Hope Globally:

Annual Meeting and Burger Bash 2.0

Although the Burger Bash is an annual spring event, this second bash of the year is planned for our community and the guests from out of town who will come together for the GHG annual meeting to share the highlights of their growing projects throughout the 3-day event.

This second burger bash will be held on Friday evening, August 4th. For a free-will donation you can enjoy burgers from Brookview, slaw, chips, beans and ice cream in the pavilion from 5:30 – 7:00PM. Just a bit after 7:00PM, you’ll want to bring the young people in your life (and a lawn chair or blanket) to sit outside of the pavilion and enjoy the Jim Barrow Comedy Magic Show. The Summer Celebration in the park is to bring awareness to an international mission effort: Growing Hope Globally.

In our community, we raise a pen of calves each year sending all profits from their sale to Growing Hope Globally for a project we select from their list. Other churches and communities might grow corn or beans, pumpkins, or produce to support specific projects in third-world countries. Participants sell the results of their efforts and send the profits to Growing Hope Globally, which sends qualified specialists to oversee the improvements including: better breeding or grasses for livestock, more efficient farming practices, and clean water systems.

New School Update:

We have made good progress on fundraising over the past three years for a new school. We are close, but we need your help. We need to add a kitchen and dining hall to feed the students attending our school. It's not something we anticipated three years ago. Our current kitchen is inadequate to feed 200+ kids per day.

The school is scheduled to open in January 2024 for the new school year. Currently the local school has an average of 100 students per teacher, and they lack teaching resources. Students share desks and text books.

Following is a cost summary of the school project:

- ♦ \$314,285 - Classroom building including septic tank, electrical, mechanical and soft landscaping
- ♦ \$280,927 - Kitchen/Dining hall including external works (moving power lines, trees, excavating)
- ♦ \$32,993 - Renovations to existing dining hall to expand our early child development center
- ♦ **\$628,205 - TOTAL PROJECT COST**
- ♦ \$461,792 - Current funding raised through Hope For Kajiado
- ♦ **\$166,653 - Funding needed** in 2023 to complete project prior to new school year in January 2024.

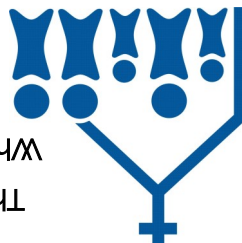
