PASTORAL COLUMN

- Moses was working as a shepherd, tending a flock of sheep, when he was suddenly called by God to lead his people out of Egypt.
- ◆ Saul was on his way to Damascus to persecute Christians when he was struck blind and called by the Lord as his chosen instrument to the Gentiles.
- Noah was found by God to be a righteous man, but he must have been some type of carpenter, for God tabbed him to build the ark, a significant new undertaking.
- Simon and Andrew were casting a net into the lake, for they were fisherman, when Jesus called them to follow him.
- ◆ Joseph and Mary were living ordinary lives until an angel of the Lord foretold of the special calling the Lord had in store for them − to be the earthly parents of Jesus!

While Exodus 34:6 tells us that God is slow to anger and 2 Peter 3:9 speaks of the Lord's patience, there are plenty of times when the Bible informs us how quickly God can act, such as in the examples above. Not only quickly, but He changes and transforms lives for His purposes.

I believe it is important for us to recall these biblical examples of the change of direction in the lives of people as we move through a time of transition once again as a congregation. Pastor Ryan's resignation came quickly as he responded to a new call from the Lord. After a solid year of learning about the congregation and forming a solid foundation of ministry, I was looking forward to his second program year with us as we had begun planning for music, worship and ministry. Change happens.

I hope you are able to know and understand that God orchestrates such change, in the lives of His people and in the life of the Church. In times of transition, I often find myself turning to the SJCC Church Constitution to read the Faith and Covenant of the congregation:

This church acknowledges as its sole Head, Jesus Christ, the Son of God and the Savior of all people. It acknowledges as brothers and sisters in Christ all who share in the confession. It looks to the Word of God in the Scriptures, and to the presence and power of the Holy Spirit, to prosper its creative and redemptive work in the world. It claims as its own the faith of the historic Church expressed in the ancient creeds and reclaimed in the basic insights of the Protestant Reformers. It affirms the responsibility of the Church in each generation to make this faith its own.

May hope and faith abound as we acknowledge Jesus Christ, look to the Word of God in the Scriptures, and look to the presence and power of the Holy Spirit.

Have faith that God will continue to provide direction through this time of transition.

Goodbyes

As Paul journeys toward his own final trials, everything seems to slow down. Luke records the names of each friend that fellowshipped with them along the way: Sopater, Aristarchus, Secundus, Gaius, Timothy, Tychichus, Trophimus, and the elders of Ephesus (<u>Acts 20:4</u>). This was a time of final goodbyes, and we read that "there was much weeping on the part of all" (<u>Acts 20:37</u>). Luke records each stopping place: Greece, Macedonia, Troas, Assos, Mitylene, Chios, Samos, and Miletus. He also counts the months and days. Each detail of that final voyage is stretched out.

Upon arriving at Miletus, Paul summons the Ephesian elders to give them his final exhortations and instructions. Paul's declaration is simple: "I do not account my life of any value nor as precious to myself, if only I may finish my course and the ministry that I received from the Lord Jesus, to testify to the gospel of the grace of God" (Acts 20:24).

In the face of sorrowful and final goodbyes, Paul had set his heart upon Christ alone, and His kingdom. Paul's hope, his confidence, his purpose, and his joy were fixed in Christ. As he declared in his letter to the Philippians, "For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain" (1:21). This too must be our eager hope and expectation. And, as Paul warns, we will face many obstacles. Wolves will come in among us, seeking to harm the flock of God. From our own midst will arise some who will deceive and seek to draw us away. How will we remain alert? Paul declares: "I commend you to God... remember the words of the Lord Jesus" (Acts 20:32, 35).

I now share these parting words with you at St. John's Christian Church. I claim no wisdom of my own, but I simply pass on the wisdom found in God's Word. I have loved every moment at SJCC. I love you all. My prayers are continually with you.

2023-2024 MINISTRY YEAR: DISCIPLESHIP & FELLOWSHIP

September 10th is Rally Sunday, the day SJCC kicks off a new year of ministry!

Throughout the coming ministry year, we will be intentionally focusing on one of eight quality characteristics used by God to build His church. This is based on results from a recent church assessment of our congregational ministries.

Holistic Small Groups is the quality characteristic of focus for the coming year. It is in such groups that Christians can find community and foster relationship, as well as spiritual interaction and support. Fellowship and discipleship is of utmost importance in the health and vitality of a congregation. We will be intentionally forming small group ministries for people of all ages, utilizing existing ministries within the mix of small group ministries.

"Discipleship and Fellowship" defines the program focus for 2023-2024. Jesus modeled discipleship and fellowship for the twelve disciples, as well as throughout his encounters with people. Discipleship and fellowship are themes of these two key passage of scripture:

CONSISTORY & COMMITTEES

Pastor of Music and Worship Position

The Consistory has chosen to delay acting upon this now vacant position. The intent is to first complete the search process for the youth and young adult position and then resume discussion of the music and worship position.

The Consistory has approved seeking some assistance with music and worship in a part-time capacity during this time of transition.

Building Committee

The committee submitted their recommendation to the Consistory on Monday, August 21st. Following much discussion, the Consistory approved calling a special congregational meeting for Sunday, September 17th to seek action upon the recommendation by the congregation. We will follow a special schedule on the 17th:

9:00AM Sunday School 10:00AM Worship

11:10AM Congregational Meeting

While a full informational packet on the recommendation will be available prior to September 10th, here is a summary of the new proposal:

- Purpose to act upon a recommendation from the Building Committee to proceed with the \$2,224,346 opinion of probable cost of the proposed renovation project to address restrooms, accessibility and worship.
- Background On November 14, 2021, the congregation approved the \$1,617,300 Facility Committee's proposal to address restrooms, accessibility and worship. A Building Committee was formed and began meeting in April of 2022. After interviewing three architectural firms, the committee agreed to contract with Beilharz Architects of Defiance, a different firm than the Facility Committee had worked with in forming the 2021 proposal.
- New Proposal after extensive work with Beilharz Architects, they presented a new opinion of probable construction cost totaling \$2,224,346. That is \$607,046 higher than the approved cost of \$1,617,300 in 2021.

- ♦ Key factors increasing the cost include:
 - Inflation
 - Discovered issues (asbestos abatement of tile and tile adhesive, undersized and improper electric service)
 - Alternatives outside the original scope (new flooring in first floor hallway, finishes expanded to adjoining spaces)
 - More detailed information on materials costs and quantities
- ♦ Funding of the project
 - Invested funds of \$2,107, 105 directed solely for capital improvement projects
 - Wise counsel suggests not depleting the entire balance of these invested funds
 - Desire is to seek additional donations to the Building Fund over the course of the year

Evangelism Committee

This year's Book Bag Bash resulted in the need to order additional book bags! Over 100 were given out on the day of the event and several more have been passed out since the event. The BBB continues to be a tremendous outreach to the community!

Search Committee for the Director/Minister/Pastor of Youth and Young Adults

The committee consists of the following volunteers: Nici Wyse (Chair and Consistory Rep), Amy Baden, Ryan Christman, Mindy Gruenhagen, Gloria Lauber, Joshua Reeb, Molly Rutledge, David Stuckey, Cayla Swisher and Pastor Erich.

The committee has entered into an agreement with Shepherds Staff, a ministry staffing firm. SJCC has been assigned two search consultants from Shepherds Staff. A Discovery Visit is scheduled for September 29-October 1, a weekend when the two consultants will be in Archbold to meet with several groups of the church.
