Bonnie Fry Mahnke, the new executive director of Toledo Gospel Rescue Mission, shared the following in their recent newsletter:

Have you ever sat amongst the ruins, walked along the streets of devastation, listened to the stories of generational defeat? I have. I have, and it changed me. It changed what I thought spreading the gospel was. I have, and it challenged me. It challenged me in what I thought serving in ministry was. I have, and it called me. It called me to sit longer, walk closer, and listen deeper. It called me to give more. To give more of my time, more of my resources, more of my life to those and for those who are searching for hope.

I believe that if everyone would spend one day walking, sitting, and listening to people who are caught in the cycle of homelessness, poverty, devastation, and ruin, just one day, it would cause a great awakening! The Gospel of Jesus Christ is one of restoration and hope; it comes to us where we are, walks, sits and listens. The Gospel of Jesus Christ rebuilds cities and LIVES, it breaks chains and set free captives. Every day at Toledo Gospel Rescue Mission, we see lives touched, hearts marked, and seeds planted for Christ and the hope that He brings.

Come sit with us, come walk with us...come listen with us; it will change you; it will challenge you; it will call you.

 1. The annual review of staff is underway, with the committee seeking feedback summaries & suggestions from the committees of the church.
 2. The job description for an Interim Director of Music Ministry was approved, with Buffy Riley approved to fill this role.
- B. Church Safety & Security Committee
 1. The committee has put new policies in place for Wednesday Evenings.
 2. New policies are in place for the nursery during the 10:30 service.
 3. The committee has done a walk through for risk assessment.
- C. Fellowship Committee - Steve Walker
 1. Rally Sunday Burger Bash went smoothly, and it was well attended. Served around 175 people at the Burger Bash. Thanks to the Kenny Walker family for cooking burgers & brats.
 2. Veterans Breakfast is coming up.
- D. Mission Committee - Missy Warncke
 1. Committee heard an update from Tony & Leila Frank.
 2. The Mission Committee will most likely exceed their 2023 budget goals.
- E. Property Committee - Matt Hines
 1. Kern's Carpet has cleaned designated carpets.
 2. Property Committee is digging deeper on projects given to them by the Building Committee.
 - a. Updating the Fireside room
 - b. Better lighting in parish hall
 - c. Kitchen remodel - talked to Theil's Construction in Blakeslee. They are going to give suggestions and ideas. Theil's uses local electricians and plumbers.
 3. Landscaping - adding stone around planting beds.
 4. Snow removal set up for this winter.
- F. Spiritual Council - Erich Christman

2. Jeff Rutledge let the architects know that the vote passed, and we are ready to move to the next phase. The Building Committee will be meeting with them soon. It should take about 5-6 months to finalize plans.
3. Betsy Redd shared that she had asked Mary Zimmerman (Treasurer) for historical financial information. Mary reported that over the last few years, approximately \$90k has been donated to the project each year. Betsy felt that it seemed reasonable to raise the \$100k needed to completely fund the project.

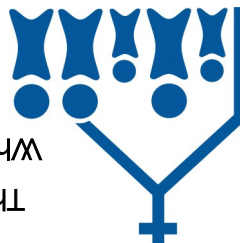
