

Nursery Care is offered during our 10:30AM service for children ages four months through preschool across from the church office. Parents can register children for Nursery Care online at www.stjohnsarchbold.org/nursery or by scanning the QR code to the left before checking into the nursery for the first time. We also have a Mother's Room located outside of the sanctuary for nursing mothers and/or mothers with young infants and toddlers. Diaper changing stations are located in

both the Mother's Room and the Nursery. An usher will gladly direct you if needed!

SCRIPTURE READING

1 Corinthians 13:4-7 Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. ⁵ It is not rude, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. ⁶ Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. ⁷ It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres.

Revelation 2:1-7 – Letter to the Church in Ephesus

Sermon Series – Revelation 2 & 3 – Letters to Seven Churches

- Each letter to one church was intended to be read by the other six churches, too.
- Addressee, Speaker, Knowledge of the Speaker, Verdict, Corrective Command, Exhortation, Promise

Addressee $-^{1}$ To the angel of the church in Ephesus write:

- Angel also messenger
- Ephesus crossroads of civilization, trade center of the area, western coast of Asia Minor, temple of Artemis (a wonder of the ancient world)
- Ephesians cosmopolitan, transient, cultural-political change, influence on the church

Speaker – These are the words of him who holds the seven stars in his right hand and walks among the seven golden lampstands:

• Drawn from chapter 1 – Jesus Christ

Knowledge $-{}^{2}$ I know your deeds, your hard work and your perseverance. I know that you cannot tolerate wicked men, that you have tested those who claim to be apostles but are not, and have found them false. ³ You have persevered and have endured hardships for my name, and have not grown weary.

Verdict – ⁴ Yet I hold this against you: You have forsaken your first love.

Corrective Command – ⁵ Remember the height from which you have fallen! Repent and do the things you did at first. If you do not repent, I will come to you and remove your lampstand from its place.

Exhortation -⁶ But you have this in your favor: You hate the practices of the Nicolaitans, which I also hate.

Nicolaitans – mentioned only here in chapter 2, a sect within the church, described as heretical, mixed faith with idolatry

Promise $-^{7}$ He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches. To him who overcomes, I will give the right to eat from the tree of life, which is in the paradise of God.
