Nursery Care is offered during our 10:30AM service for children ages four months through preschool across from the church office. We also have a Mother's Room located outside of the sanctuary for nursing mothers and/or mothers with young infants and toddlers. Diaper changing stations are located in

SERMON NOTES - "PERGAMUM: COMPROMISING"

Revelation 2:12-17 - Letter to the Church in Pergamum - "Compromising"

Addressee – "12 To the angel of the church in Pergamum write:"

- An inland city, 65 miles north of Smyrna, 105 miles north of Ephesus
- ♦ Library of 200,000 volumes, four temples to Greek gods, three temples to the emperor

Speaker – "These are the words of him who has the sharp, double-edged sword."

- ♦ Revelation 1:16 "...out of his mouth came a sharp double-edged sword."
- Christ will use this sword against the Balaamites and Nicolaitans.

Knowledge – "¹³I know where you live -- where Satan has his throne. Yet you remain true to my name. You did not renounce your faith in me, even in the days of Antipas, my faithful witness, who was put to death in your city -- where Satan lives."

- The Christians in P. live in a hostile and difficult place
- Where Satan lives reference to P. as a center of worship of pagan gods, of idolatry
- To profess faith in Christ in such a city would provoke hostility
- Antipas, only mentioned in this verse, must have been martyred for his faith in Christ
- Satan works to undermine loyalty to Christ by persecution

Verdict – "¹⁴Nevertheless, I have a few things against you: You have people there who hold to the teaching of Balaam, who taught Balak to entice the Israelites to sin by eating food sacrificed to idols and by committing sexual immorality. ¹⁵ Likewise you also have those who hold to the teaching of the Nicolaitans."

- There is division in the church
- Balaam, a symbol of corruption, immorality and idolatry
- ◆ Too tolerant and accepting of false doctrines and immoral living (1 Corinthians 5:1-9)

Corrective Command - ¹⁶ Repent therefore! Otherwise, I will soon come to you and will fight against them with the sword of my mouth.

- ♦ 5 of the 7 churches are told to repent
- The church faces judgment (1 Peter 4:1), Jesus will confront with his Word

Exhortation and Promise - ¹⁷ He who has an ear, let him hear what the Spirit says to the churches. To him who overcomes, I will give some of the hidden manna. I will also give him a white stone with a new name written on it, known only to him who receives it.

- ♦ Hidden manna, reference to the true bread from heaven (John 6:41)
- White stone, a symbol for the assurance of blessing
- New name, another assurance of a Christian's heavenly home
