

#### Nursery Care/Mother's Room/Diaper Changing Stations



Nursery Care is offered during our 10:30AM service for children ages four months through preschool in the second floor room labelled "Artisan's Tent." Parents can register children for Nursery Care online at www.stjohnsarchbold.org/nursery or by scanning the QR code to the left before checking into the nursery for the first time. We also have a Mother's Room located outside of the sanctuary for nursing mothers and/or mothers with young infants and toddlers. Diaper changing sta-

tions are located in both the Mother's Room and the Nursery. An usher will gladly direct you if needed!

#### SCRIPTURE READING

**Micah 6:6-8** With what shall I come before the Lord and bow down before the exalted God? Shall I come before him with burnt offerings, with calves a year old? <sup>7</sup> Will the Lord be pleased with thousands of rams, with ten thousand rivers of oil? Shall I offer my firstborn for my transgression, the fruit of my body for the sin of my soul? <sup>8</sup> He has showed you, O man, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God.

**John 19:28-30** Later, knowing that all was now completed, and so that the Scripture would be fulfilled, Jesus said, "I am thirsty." <sup>29</sup> A jar of wine vinegar was there, so they soaked a sponge in it, put the sponge on a stalk of the hyssop plant, and lifted it to Jesus' lips. <sup>30</sup> When he had received the drink, Jesus said, "It is finished." With that, he bowed his head and gave up his spirit.

**Luke 23:44-46** It was now about the sixth hour, and darkness came over the whole land until the ninth hour, <sup>45</sup> for the sun stopped shining. And the curtain of the temple was torn in two. <sup>46</sup> Jesus called out with a loud voice, "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit." When he had said this, he breathed his last.

## SERMON NOTES - "AT CALVARY: THREE WORDS AT THE END"

The Season of Lent is when the passion and death of our Savior come into focus. It's observed as a time for growth in faith, as well as a time for deepening the devotional life of faithful Christians. It's an invitation to 40 days of renewal, 40 days to prepare ourselves to take in the Good News of Easter through the disciplines of prayer, self-denial, and rededication.

Calvary

- The location where Jesus was crucified, just outside the city of Jerusalem
- The word "Calvary" found only in Luke 23:33 (KJV)
- "Calvary" from the Latin "Calvaria" which translates from the Greek "kranion" (skull) and the Aramaic/Hebrew "gulgulta" (Golgotha) ("place of the skull")
- Matthew 27:33 "to a place called Golgotha (which means The Place of the Skull)."
- Mark 15:22 "to the place called Golgotha (which means The Place of the Skull)."
- Luke 23:33 "to the place called the Skull, there they crucified him,"
- John 19:17 "to the place of the Skull (which in Aramaic is called Golgotha)."
- The name probably came from the shape of the low, rounded hill.

Three Words (Sayings) of Jesus from the Cross

- Jesus uttered seven words in all from the cross
- John 19:28-23
  - ♦ All was now completed, scripture would be fulfilled
  - His work, his life and his sacrificial death on the cross was fulfilled
  - 2 Corinthians 5:21 God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.
  - I am thirsty" hyssop a connection to Passover
  - ◊ "It is finished" promises and prophecies, obedience and justice
- Luke 23:44-46
  - Curtain of the temple torn in two
  - ◊ "Father, into your hands I commit my spirit."
  - With prayer Jesus yielded his living spirit to God the Father as he yielded his body to death on the cross.

### BUILDING PROJECT STATUS REPORT AS OF APRIL 3, 2025

- New Restrooms, Custodian Room, Elevator Shaft, Preschool Room
  - The concrete floor around the elevator shaft was poured on Tuesday. Once the concrete is sufficiently set/cured, masons will lay block in preparation for setting a lintel for the elevator doorway and doorway to the custodian room.
  - Further work was done on ductwork for exhaust and HVAC.
  - New connection was made to the exterior sanitary sewer line on the east side of the building.
  - Work will be done to shore up the first floor ceiling so the hole can be cut in to the ceiling for the elevator shaft.
- New Electric Service
  - Directional boring for underground conduit was to start on Friday.
- Adjusted Schedule of Work
  - ♦ April 21<sup>st</sup> Sanctuary pew removal, potentially accomplished in 3 days.
  - April 27<sup>th</sup> Final worship service in the sanctuary until late July for seating, we will use 84 new chapel chairs, 36 new sanctuary chairs, and 36 unity pews that used to be in the chapel.
  - ♦ April 29<sup>th</sup> Sanctuary asbestos removal could begin.
  - Sanctuary work is to be completed by July 28<sup>th</sup>.
