We also have a Mother's Room located outside of the sanctuary for nursing mothers and/or mothers with young infants and toddlers. Diaper changing sta-

BUILDING PROJECT STATUS REPORT AS OF APRIL 24, 2025

- ♦ New Restrooms, Custodian Room, Elevator Shaft, Preschool Room
 - ♦ The roughly 8'x8' section of concrete has been removed from the second floor to make way for the elevator shaft – that work required building a platform in the first floor under the concrete to be cut, so that the cut pieces of concrete couldn't free fall to the level of the first floor.

♦ New Electric Service

Creighton Electric has installed the new electric panels in the boiler room and pulled the necessary wires from the new utility pole to the transformer base, and then from the transformer base to the boiler room.

♦ Sanctuary

- Over the course of two days, workers from Weberding removed the pews and hauled them to their shop in Batesville, IN.
- Removal of sanctuary items will start on Monday, then carpet will be removed so the company removing the asbestos floor tile can begin their work, hopefully on Wednesday.
- Electrical work began weeks ago to run new conduit through the tunnels to the sanctuary, and the company assessed current breaker panels this past week in preparation for new connections.
- Work is ongoing by volunteers of the church to prepare the chapel and the gym for worship services, including temporary sound and projection systems.

♦ Adjusted Schedule of Work

- April 27th final worship services in the sanctuary until late July for seating, we will use 84 new chapel chairs, 36 new sanctuary chairs, and 36 unity pews that used to be in the chapel
- Sanctuary work is to be completed by July 28th
