

Nursery Care is offered during our 10:30AM service for children ages four months through preschool in the second floor room labeled "Artisan's Tent." Parents can register children for Nursery Care online at www.stjohnsarchbold.org/nursery or by scanning the QR code to the left before checking into the nursery for the first time. We also have a Mother's Room located outside of the sanctuary for nursing mothers and/or mothers with young infants and toddlers. Diaper changing sta-

tions are located in both the Mother's Room and the Nursery. An usher will gladly direct you if needed!

Children's Busy Bags are located in the gym for children ages one-year to third grade. Bags are marked by age (**Pink** = Ages 1-2; **Green** = Ages 3-5; **Yellow** = Grades K-3). 
MISSION-A-MONTH - CHERRY STREET MISSION/SPARROW'S NEST

Cherry Street Mission in Toledo, Ohio, was founded on Biblical principals in 1947, and remains a Biblically based, Christ-centered organization today. Their Spiritual Advocates consist of both staff and volunteers that lead Bible studies daily and mentor guests through their journey with Christ. Cherry Street has a Men's Division, Women's Division (Sparrow's Nest) and food services. Each night, Cherry Street provides safe, free shelter for nearly 230 men and women who would otherwise sleep on the street or remain in an abusive situation. Cherry Street is more than food, clothing and shelter. Their redemptive programming is built around one on one discipleship. Cherry Street is the only organization in the region to offer three meals a day, seven days a week, free of charge to anyone who needs them. For more information, visit cherrystreetmission.org/. BUILDING PROJECT STATUS REPORT AS OF MAY 16, 2025

- New Restrooms, Custodian Room, Elevator Shaft, Preschool Room
 - ♦ Steel columns and beams have been set into the attic, just below the roof trusses.
 - The work of laying wall tile in the two bathrooms has been well started this week.
- New Electric Service
 - A different circuit breaker had to be ordered for one of the main circuits coming into the boiler room, so no further work can be performed until that breaker arrives.
- Sanctuary
 - Painting of the sanctuary walls continued this past week, as well as stairwell and hallways.
 - Floor joists and plywood were laid in what will be a new worship storage space, with work being done to lay wood in the choir loft area to match up with the level of the chancel floor.
 - ◊ Further conduit and wiring were run in the sanctuary.
 - ◊ TV mounts were installed in the sanctuary.
- Adjusted Schedule of Work
 - Sanctuary work is to be completed by July 28th.
 - The original boiler is scheduled to be removed on May 19th.
