

SCRIPTURE READING

Daniel 6:26-27 "I issue a decree that in every part of my kingdom people must fear and reverence the God of Daniel. "For he is the living God and he endures forever; his kingdom will not be destroyed, his dominion will never end.²⁷ He rescues and he saves; he performs signs and wonders in the heavens and on the earth. He has rescued Daniel from the power of the lions."

Matthew 5:17-20 "Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but to fulfill them.¹⁸ I tell you the truth, until heaven and earth disappear, not the smallest letter, not the least stroke of a pen, will by any means disappear from the Law until everything is accomplished.¹⁹ Anyone who breaks one of the least of these commandments and teaches others to do the same will be called least in the kingdom of heaven, but whoever practices and teaches these commands will be called great in the kingdom of heaven.²⁰ For I tell you that unless your righteousness surpasses that of the Pharisees and the teachers of the law, you will certainly not enter the kingdom of heaven.

Matthew 22:34-40 Hearing that Jesus had silenced the Sadducees, the Pharisees got together. ³⁵ One of them, an expert in the law, tested him with this question: ³⁶ "Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?" ³⁷ Jesus replied: "'Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' ³⁸ This is the first and greatest commandment. ³⁹ And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' ⁴⁰ All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments."

MISSION-A-MONTH - HABITAT FOR HUMANITY - FULTON COUNTY

Habitat for Humanity of Fulton County, Ohio (HFHFCO) builds and repairs homes in Fulton County, Ohio for people who need affordable housing and have little or no means to better their circumstances through conventional avenues. We partner with people who are willing to work for what they need, giving a hand up, never a hand out. This principle teaches skills so partners can provide for themselves and teach their children and grandchildren to do the same. Each project requires pay back of the project price (determined through set standards). These payments are affordable because no interest is charged. Project costs are kept low through donations and volunteer labor from those in our communities. Principal payments from partnerhomeowners are used to fund the mission, but isn't enough so we rely on donations, fundraisers and grants. This month, we ask that you prayerfully consider supporting this community ministry. You can give to HFHFCO by marking Line 11 or 12 of your offering envelope or by selecting "HFHFCO" in the "Give to" drop-down menu in Breeze's online giving feature.  - He rescues and saves, he performs signs and wonders

Matthew 5:17-20

- A segment of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount
- A description of Jesus fulfilling the Law, the Old Testament Law
- The Law: 1) Ten Commandments, 2) First Five Books of the Bible, 3) The Law and the Prophets the whole of Scripture, 4) the Oral Law
- The purpose of God disclosed through the prophets and the demands of God that his people obey him have found their fulfillment in Jesus, with no relaxation of the strictness of the commandments (The Interpreter's Commentary on the Bible)


Matthew 22:34-40

- The passage often described as a summation of the Ten Commandments: Love the Lord your God...speaks of the first four of the Ten Love your neighbor...speaks of the last six of the Ten
- V. 40 "All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments."

Thoughts (www.compellingtruth.org)

- The Bible is the story of God's interaction with the world
- The Old Testament records the beginning of that story
- God reveals His nature and His purpose through His Word
 - To ignore the Old Testament is like making a new friend and never asking about their past

- The annual summer mission trip to LaPorte County Habitat for Humanity in northern Indiana is set for June 16th 20th. The group will meet at the church at 7AM Monday morning and after four and a half days of home construction work, will return to Archbold late Friday afternoon. There is always work for people of various skill levels, with plenty of opportunity to learn how to use power tools! Lodging will be at a local rental home or possibly a church camp. Cost of the week, to cover transportation, lodging and meal costs, will be \$100 to \$125, depending upon number of participants. A sign-up sheet is on the bulletin board.

Phase One


- New Restrooms Wall tile and floor tile have been installed and grout began to be applied the week of May 27th. Next will come the ceilings, doors, fixture installation, partitions and dispensers.
- Elevator All structural steel has been set in place, with walls of the shaft to be set as part of setting the walls for the custodian room and the preschool room.
- Plumbing/HVAC Schlatter's Plumbing removed the original boiler over the course of two days – a crew of men used a plasma cutter to cut the interior radiators/exchangers in half, and then used a self-lifting cart to get the halves up the stairs and out on to a trailer. A new 2" water meter is to be installed in the boiler room in order to have proper water pressure for the new restrooms. Two new boilers and a new water heater will soon be installed in the boiler room.
- New Electric Service Creighton Electric has finished the connections from the exterior cabinet to the main breaker panel in the boiler room. The work passed inspection by Wood County. Next is waiting for Toledo Edison to set the new transformer, just north of the Fireside Room.
- Plumbing for the second floor restroom and custodial room has been installed.

Phase Two – Sanctuary

- Lanzer's has installed new framing for making the chancel floor one level, framing for the ramp, and framing for the new worship storage space. They need to finish adding a first layer of plywood, after insulating underneath, then they will add a second layer of plywood for strength and noise deadening.
- Wyse Electric has installed new rails and spot lights that will light the chancel and altar. They are in the process of running new wiring for the LED light fixtures that will hang over the pews. They have begun running conduit for updated wiring for the sound system, and will soon be running conduit and wiring for the new TV and projection system.
- The sanctuary walls have been painted, as well as both stairwells.

Additional Work

- A crew is ready to begin replacement of the steps/pads at several of exterior entrances of the building, starting at the west entrance.
- A subcontractor has replaced the entrance doors at the carport, installing a new sliding door system that will be operated by a sensor on the outside and a touch pad on the inside. Until that door installation is complete, the carport doors are non-operable.
