SCRIPTURE READING

Acts 13:32-37 "We tell you the good news: What God promised our fathers ³³ he has fulfilled for us, their children, by raising up Jesus. As it is written in the second Psalm: "'You are my Son; today I have become your Father.' ³⁴ The fact that God raised him from the dead, never to decay, is stated in these words: "'I will give you the holy and sure blessings promised to David.' ³⁵ So it is stated elsewhere: "'You will not let your Holy One see decay.' ³⁶ "For when David had served God's purpose in his own generation, he fell asleep; he was buried with his fathers and his body decayed. ³⁷ But the one whom God raised from the dead did not see decay.

Mark 1:1-11 The beginning of the gospel about Jesus Christ, the Son of God. ² It is written in Isaiah the prophet: "I will send my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way" -- ³ "a voice of one calling in the desert, 'Prepare the way for the Lord, make straight paths for him.'" ⁴ And so John came, baptizing in the desert region and preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. ⁵ The whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem went out to him. Confessing their sins, they were baptized by him in the Jordan River. ⁶ John wore clothing made of camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. ⁷ And this was his message: "After me will come one more powerful than I, the thongs of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie. ⁸ I baptize you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit." ⁹ At that time Jesus came from Nazareth in Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. ¹⁰ As Jesus was coming up out of the water, he saw heaven being torn open and the Spirit descending on him like a dove. ¹¹ And a voice came from heaven: "You are my Son, whom I love; with you I am well pleased."

SERMON NOTES "THE GOD OF MIRACLES: BAPTIZED IN THE DESERT"

- Mark, the author
 - ♦ The gospel is anonymous, church tradition associates it with John Mark of the NT.
 - ♦ Associated with Peter, Peter's interpreter, writing what he learned from Peter.
 - ♦ Acts 12:12 After Peter's escape from prison, he went to the house of Mary, the mother of John, also called Mark; Acts 12:25 accompanied Barnabas and Saul when they returned to Antioch, a cousin of Barnabas; Acts 13:5 a helper to Paul and Barnabas on their first missionary journey; Acts 13:13 returned to Jerusalem; Acts 15:36...Paul refused to have Mark accompany him since he had left them
 - ♦ Gospel written between 64 and 70 A.D., after the death of Peter.
 - No genealogy, no birth narrative; a focus on the sufferings of Jesus maybe to prepare people for suffering – with a focus on the cross, and discipleship; highlighting salvation through Jesus Christ.
 - ♦ Acts 10:37 Peter began his speech by citing the baptism John preached.
- Beginning A new beginning in which God reveals the gospel of Jesus Christ.
- ♦ Exodus 23:20 Mark 1:2a A messenger, to guard the way.
- ◆ Connection with the Old Testament Exodus 23:20, Malachi 3:1, Isaiah 40:3 true understanding of the ministry of Jesus must be grounded in the Old Testament.

John the Baptist

- ♦ Desert region West of the Dead Sea, uninhabited, open, wild, arid territory.
- ♦ Qumran sect An influence on his ascetic life and stern discipline.
- ♦ A baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sin, repentance was occurring a deliberate change, deliberate turning.
- ◊ John's preaching aroused interest and caused a great stir.
- ♦ 20 miles between Jerusalem and the Jordan River, and about 4,000 feet above it not an easy hike from the city to the river, and back, to listen to John.
- Open confession of sin, then baptism occurred.
- ◆ Vs 7-8 A brief message, a focus on the Mighty One, bringing a purging, purifying, judging baptism through the Holy Spirit.
- ♦ Vs 9-11
 - ♦ To fulfill all righteousness referring to God's plan and purpose for Jesus.
 - ♦ Jesus, from the beginning of his ministry, identifies with people and their sin.
 - 2 Corinthians 5:21 God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.
 - ♦ A cosmic event, an anointing of Jesus for ministry (Luke 4:18) making very, very clear who Jesus is — the Son of God.

MISSION-A-MONTH - HABITAT FOR HUMANITY - FULTON COUNTY

Habitat for Humanity of Fulton County, Ohio (HFHFCO) builds and repairs homes in Fulton County, Ohio for people who need affordable housing and have little or no means to better their circumstances through conventional avenues. We partner with people who are willing to work for what they need, giving a hand up, never a hand out. Each project requires pay back of the project price (determined through set standards). These payments are affordable because no interest is charged. Project costs are kept low through donations and volunteer labor from those in our communities. Principal payments from partner-homeowners are used to fund the mission, but isn't enough so we rely on donations, fundraisers and grants. This month, we ask that you prayerfully consider supporting this community ministry. BUILDING PROJECT STATUS REPORT AS OF JUNE 12, 2025

Phase One

- New Restrooms Final work details continue to be accomplished all toilets, urinals, countertops, sinks, mirrors, and lights have been installed, door frames were installed on Thursday, and stall partitions should be in this next week.
- Elevator Interior shaft drywall has been installed up into the attic, with some stub walls to be added on the interior hallway side of both floors is next on the list.
- Walls for the custodial rooms on both the first and second floors, walls for the preschool restroom, and walls for the second floor restroom are being laid out.
- ◆ Plumbing/HVAC Water connections have been made to the restrooms and holes in the exterior walls will soon be cut in order to run air vent lines to the outside; some of the exterior A/C units have been set on the concrete pads, and the two large air handlers have been set into place.
- New Electric Service Awaiting the installation of the transformer from Toledo Edison.

Phase Two – Sanctuary

- ♦ The electricians continue with running electric and tech system wiring. The new overhead pendent lines are due to arrive this next week.
- The pew company believes they could start installing the refinished pews the week of July 14.
- Installation of the vinyl flooring under the pews is being scheduled, then pews will be set, and carpet installation to follow

Additional Work

- Replacement of the concrete at the west entrance of the church was started on Thursday.
- The staining and finishing of oak doors and trim has been started.
- Final quotes are being received for the coffee bar, which will be located in the parlor.
- ◆ The storage building is being organized and cleared out, preparing for an upcoming silent auction, or two, in which people of the congregation may bid on items no longer needed. Such items include: sanctuary pews, sanctuary lights, cabinets, various items of furniture, etc.
