### MISSION-A-MONTH FOR JULY - SHEPHERD CIRCLE

Shepherd Circle began as a local mission projected with the intent to mentor individuals or families who are good people that have made bad choices.

Recently, the board of Shepherd Circle was led to change their intent. Factors leading to this change included a lack of volunteers to serve as shepherds to mentor the people and a lack of new, younger volunteers to serve on the board.

So Shepherd Circle will be "gifting" money to an individual or family just sort of stuck. They are not thinking of rent and utilities but rather of bigger one-time barriers like maybe reinstatement fees with the Bureau of Motor Vehicles, or maybe years ago they left the partner they married, yet because of no funds, never got a legal divorce. Maybe their toilets don't flush or the ceiling is falling down. Maybe they'd like to take a class and get a better job, but there are no funds in the budget for that.

There is no deadline for these efforts. They are starting now and ending if/when the funds run low. Our support of Shepherd Circle in these efforts will be a blessing to people who find out about this intent and who apply. # **BUILDING PROJECT STATUS REPORT AS OF JULY 19, 2025**

It was a week of no electric power at the church. Early Monday morning, the crews began the process of switching electric service from the original service to the new service, and as a result, there was no electricity in much of the building until Friday afternoon. That is when power was restored to the offices, enabling access to the computer network once again.

In the boiler room, down the south stairway, the original electric panels were located on the east wall, and now the new, much larger panels, are located on the north wall. Any of the panels that needed to remain on the east wall were replaced with new panels.

As of Friday afternoon, the only air conditioning system not working was the one in the gym!

#### Restrooms

• The demolition work in the south restrooms is finished and now the work will begin to install the new utilities and walls.

#### Status of Sanctuary:

- Installation and adjustments of the overhead pendant lights was completed this past week.
- ◆ Chalk lines were laid on the concrete floor in preparation for the LVT flooring to be installed, which is scheduled for tomorrow, July 21<sup>st</sup>. The LVT will be the flooring under the pews and in the balcony.
- The oak facing of the ramp and front of the chancel walls was begun this past week.
- Pew installation has been reset for the week of August 11<sup>th</sup>.
- Following pew installation, carpet will be installed in the aisles. Chancel area carpet will be installed once oak trim and ramp railings are in place.
- The new ceiling finish of the sanctuary narthex has yet to be started.

#### Other areas:

- The subcontractor continues with the various exterior step and sidewalk work, saving the south porch replacement and new ramp installation until last.
- Elevator installation is confirmed for August 13<sup>th</sup>.
- Work continues on installation of HVAC ductwork, air handlers and compressors most work in the attic is complete and now they are working in the storage area off of the youth room and in the storage area off the sanctuary balcony.

It remains the intent of the Mel Lanzer Company to complete the entire project by November.
