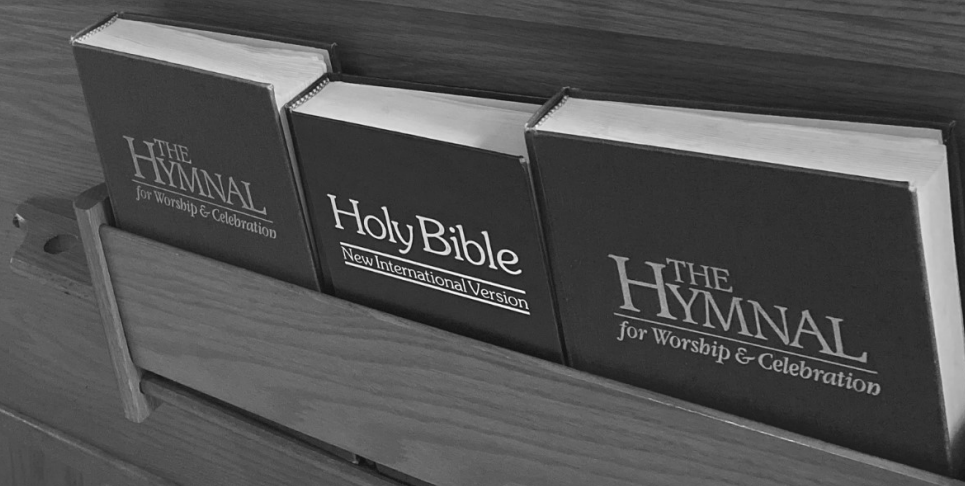

SCRIPTURE READING

**Genesis 22:1-14** Some time later God tested Abraham. He said to him, "Abraham!" "Here I am," he replied. <sup>2</sup> Then God said, "Take your son, your only son, Isaac, whom you love, and go to the region of Moriah. Sacrifice him there as a burnt offering on one of the mountains I will tell you about." <sup>3</sup> Early the next morning Abraham got up and saddled his donkey. He took with him two of his servants and his son Isaac. When he had cut enough wood for the burnt offering, he set out for the place God had told him about. <sup>4</sup> On the third day Abraham looked up and saw the place in the distance. <sup>5</sup> He said to his servants, "Stay here with the donkey while I and the boy go over there. We will worship and then we will come back to you." <sup>6</sup> Abraham took the wood for the burnt offering and placed it on his son Isaac, and he himself carried the fire and the knife. As the two of them went on together, <sup>7</sup> Isaac spoke up and said to his father Abraham, "Father?" "Yes, my son?" Abraham replied. "The fire and wood are here," Isaac said, "but where is the lamb for the burnt offering?" <sup>8</sup> Abraham answered, "God himself will provide the lamb for the burnt offering, my son." And the two of them went on together. <sup>9</sup> When they reached the place God had told him about, Abraham built an altar there and arranged the wood on it. He bound his son Isaac and laid him on the altar, on top of the wood. <sup>10</sup> Then he reached out his hand and took the knife to slay his son. <sup>11</sup> But the angel of the Lord called out to him from heaven, "Abraham! Abraham!" "Here I am," he replied. <sup>12</sup> "Do not lay a hand on the boy," he said. "Do not do anything to him. Now I know that you fear God, because you have not withheld from me your son, your only son." <sup>13</sup> Abraham looked up and there in a thicket he saw a ram caught by its horns. He went over and took the ram and sacrificed it as a burnt offering instead of his son. <sup>14</sup> So Abraham called that place The Lord Will Provide. And to this day it is said, "On the mountain of the Lord it will be provided."

**Hebrews 11:19** Abraham reasoned that God could raise the dead, and figuratively speaking, he did receive Isaac back from death.

# BUILDING PROJECT STATUS REPORT AS OF AUGUST 7, 2025

---

## North Restrooms (new)

- ◆ Exhaust vents are now in operation.

## South Restrooms

- ◆ The work of setting walls, door frames, plumbing lines, electrical lines and HVAC lines and ductwork continues.

## Mother's Room

- ◆ Heating and cooling is now operational.

## Chapel

- ◆ Plans are to hopefully have the new air conditioning in operation this Sunday.

## Status of Sanctuary:

- ◆ The LVT flooring under the pews and in the balcony has been installed.
- ◆ Waiting on risers to be finished and metal nosing to be installed on the balcony.
- ◆ Update on pew installation, it is now set for the week of August 18<sup>th</sup>.
- ◆ Following pew installation, carpet will be installed in the aisles. Chancel area carpet will be installed once oak trim and ramp railings are in place.
- ◆ The new ceiling finish of the sanctuary narthex was addressed this past week.
- ◆ Torrence Sound Equipment has begun installation work installing TV's and connecting sound equipment.
- ◆ New storage room walls and door should be finished by the end of next week.
- ◆ The modified pulpit and lectern will be returned this week from Sauder Mfg.

## Other areas:

- ◆ The concrete subcontractor has finished the work at the west entrance, the vestry and gym entrances, and the kitchen and Fireside entrances. Work to replace the south porch concrete floor and steps, and construct the new ramp, will begin in a month or so.
- ◆ Elevator installation is being delayed as some design changes are being addressed with the elevator shaft – modifications are on going.
- ◆ Work continues on installation of HVAC ductwork, air handlers, compressors and electrical.
- ◆ All overhead service lines to the building have been removed. RTEC has installed the underground internet connection to the building.
- ◆ Main hallway ceiling has been taped and mudded. It will soon be ready for paint.
- ◆ Painting will start in the upstairs classrooms this next week.
- ◆ Youth room walls have also been taped and mudded, and ready for painting.

It remains the intent of the Mel Lanzer Company to complete the entire project by November.
