We seek to live in God's truth, being obedient to His Word and following in His ways.


Welcome! We are so glad you are here.







BUILDING PROJECT STATUS REPORT AS OF AUGUST 28, 2025

South Restrooms:

 The work of setting walls, door frames, plumbing lines, electrical lines and HVAC lines and ductwork is mostly complete. Walls are ready for drywall and ceiling work will begin soon.

Status of Sanctuary:

- Risers are finished and nosing installed on the balcony floor.
- Pews are installed on the main floor and balcony pews to be set and installed the week of Sept. 1st.
- Carpet will hopefully be laid in the aisles and chancel area the week of Sept. 8th.
- The new ceiling finish of the sanctuary narthex will be finished this week and vinyl flooring to follow..
- ♦ Torrence Sound Equipment has begun installation work on TV's and connecting sound equipment.
- New storage room walls and door are finished.
- The modified pulpit and lectern have been returned.
- Plan is to have the sanctuary ready for occupancy sometime in September.
- AC unit is operational for the balcony and narthex.
- Railings for the wheel chair ramp are being installed.

Other areas:

- Work to replace the south porch concrete floor and steps, and construct the new ramp, will begin in September.
- Elevator installation is being delayed as some design changes are being addressed with the elevator shaft and fire alarm system.
- Work continues on installation of HVAC ductwork, air handlers, compressors and electrical.
- Main hallway ceiling has been painted and waiting on light islands to be constructed.
- Youth room walls have been painted and acoustical panels installed. Waiting on carpet.
- Painting of upstairs is almost complete.
- Grid work for ceiling panels is complete in second floor class rooms. Light panels and ductwork diffusers are being installed.
- Work has begun on converting the new boilers to the existing in-floor radiant heat. The insert & exhaust piping will be installed this week in the existing chimney, which will require a large crane to place 60 ft. of piping.
- Soon, the ceramic tile in the hallway will be removed for eventual installation of vinyl flooring.
- Parlor and rooms on the west side need ductwork installed to start that part of the project.

It remains the intent of the Mel Lanzer Company to complete the entire project by November.
