BUILDING PROJECT STATUS REPORT AS OF OCTOBER 23, 2025

Building Access

• Now that the south entrance is closed off, access to the building will be through the two east entrances and the Fireside Room entrance.

South Restrooms and Preschool Restroom

Installation of floor and wall tile was completed this week, as well as the grouting of the tile.

Sanctuary

- ◆ Though the 10:30AM services are now being held in the sanctuary, there remain several small tasks to be finished outlet box covers, some sound system wiring at the front, some touch up painting, carpet for the pulpit steps, and the like.
- ◆ A TV monitor will be installed for the balcony, hanging from the south side of the ceiling.

Other areas

- Elevator Installation is mostly complete, but the installation crew was pulled off to another
 job before they could finish. Once they are back to finish the install, the process of testing and
 inspection will commence.
- ♦ HVAC Heat systems were turned on this past week and the work of setting thermostats, sensors and controls is underway. Screen fencing will be installed around the exterior airconditioning units at the carport and south porch.
- First Floor The "cloud" system in the center portion of the hall is nearing completion, adding additional light to the hallway; final framing and drywall is being done around the elevator, custodian room and preschool room.
- ◆ The Second Floor Restroom, Custodial Room and Elevator Shaft need final framing and drywall to be accomplished.
- ♦ The week of October 27th should see the removal of the white quarry tile throughout the first floor hallway, the installation of doors, and installation of remaining ceiling tiles.
- ◆ The Building Committee is addressing several areas affected by the project coffee bar (for the parlor); coat racks; storage units in custodian rooms, church office, preschool room, and the balcony; furniture needs; landscaping; paraments (altar, lectern and pulpit cloths); room signage; stained glass repair; internet and network system; security system; parlor window treatments; hallway décor; and a few other odds and ends.

Additional Note – Timing delays are occurring due to the lack of available workers with some of the subcontractors working on our project (which is occurring with many other northwest Ohio projects). The Lanzer company is doing their best to get subcontractors on site to finish the project.

Anticipated Project Completion - December 1st.

BREEZE APP HELP DESK

It's that time of the year! The church office is kindly asking everyone to update their Breeze profiles as we head into a new calendar year. Breeze is an essential tool for St. John's, acting as our online directory, membership database, communication system, and much more! Please use one of the following to update your information ahead of 2026:

If you are new to SJCC or Breeze...

Active congregational households that do not currently have a Breeze profile will receive a registration email the week of November 10th. This email will contain instructions on how to set up your new Breeze profile, creating a unique username and password, and will allow you to directly update your personal Breeze profile. This will also give you access to the church's online directory should you need to look up contact information.

If you have an existing Breeze account...

Please log in and verify that your household contact information is up to date, including your household address, phone numbers, and all birthdays. If you need help editing your information, please contact Gloria Beck in the church office.

If you're a new or existing Breeze App user...

- 1. You can download the Breeze ChMS app from the Apple App Store or the Google Play Store
- 2. Open the app and enter our church's subdomain: stjohnschristianchurch
- 3. Enter your username and password
 - **a.** If you've forgotten your password, tap the "Forgot Password" link to receive a reset email
- 4. Troubleshooting...
 - a. Breeze makes frequent updates to their apps, which can often log us out. Make sure you have the subdomain, your username, and password saved in a safe spot for app updates!

SILENT AUCTION FOR BUILDING PROJECT ITEMS

As the building project moves towards completion, it is time to begin clearing out the storage building of items no longer needed in the church building. The Consistory has approved the following process:

- 1. Items will first be made available to the people of the congregation, through a silent auction process. Times will be scheduled for viewing the items. Silent bids may be given to the church office with name, phone number, item # and bid amount.
- 2. If there is no interest in specific items, efforts will be made to list the items on Facebook Marketplace.
- 3. Any items not taken through the silent auction or through the marketplace will be recycled or discarded.

To begin with, there are two types of items being put up for the silent auction:

- 1. Pews, of varying lengths, with the original red upholstery still on them.
 - ♦ Twelve 13' pews
 - ♦ Two 7' pews
 - ♦ One 4' pew
 - ♦ One 15' pew
 - ♦ Two 43" double seat pews
 - ♦ Two front rails
- 2. Hanging lights
 - ♦ Twelve from the sanctuary
 - ♦ Two from the balcony
 - Four from the narthex

Starting the week of **November 3**rd, the porch door to the storage building will be **unlocked from 8:00AM to 8:00PM each day** in order for people to look at the pews and lights. Upon entry into the building, the light switch is on the right hand side of the door, behind a post. Please turn the lights off when you leave. The silent auction for these items **will end on November 15**th.

There are many items in the storage building that will either be returned to the church building, available by silent auction at another time, or there are stacks of play house parts from a recent Habitat for Humanity work day with Archbold high school students.
