
Welcome! We are so glad you are here.

SCRIPTURE READINGS

Acts 14:17 Yet he has not left himself without testimony: He has shown kindness by giving you rain from heaven and crops in their seasons; he provides you with plenty of food and fills your hearts with joy."

Mark 4:3-9 "Listen! A farmer went out to sow his seed. ⁴ As he was scattering the seed, some fell along the path, and the birds came and ate it up. ⁵ Some fell on rocky places, where it did not have much soil. It sprang up quickly, because the soil was shallow. ⁶ But when the sun came up, the plants were scorched, and they withered because they had no root. ⁷ Other seed fell among thorns, which grew up and choked the plants, so that they did not bear grain. ⁸ Still other seed fell on good soil. It came up, grew and produced a crop, multiplying thirty, sixty, or even a hundred times." ⁹ Then Jesus said, "He who has ears to hear, let him hear."

Mark 4:13-20 Then Jesus said to them, "Don't you understand this parable? How then will you understand any parable? ¹⁴ The farmer sows the word. ¹⁵ Some people are like seed along the path, where the word is sown. As soon as they hear it, Satan comes and takes away the word that was sown in them. ¹⁶ Others, like seed sown on rocky places, hear the word and at once receive it with joy. ¹⁷ But since they have no root, they last only a short time. When trouble or persecution comes because of the word, they quickly fall away. ¹⁸ Still others, like seed sown among thorns, hear the word; ¹⁹ but the worries of this life, the deceitfulness of wealth and the desires for other things come in and choke the word, making it unfruitful. ²⁰ Others, like seed sown on good soil, hear the word, accept it, and produce a crop-- thirty, sixty or even a hundred times what was sown."

BUILDING PROJECT STATUS REPORT AS OF NOVEMBER 13, 2025

Punch List

- "Punch List" is the term given to a list of items of concern that need to be addressed before the project can be considered finished. The building committee has walked all areas of the project to create such a list, which will then be reviewed with the general contractor and architects.
- Life Planning youth and adults engaged in a service night on Wednesday, helping to move many items back in to place in the second floor, as well as clearing out the gym and cleaning the youth room. Their efforts were fantastic and are greatly appreciated!

Building Access

- The last three entrance doors were replaced this week, with temporary closers and latches, while awaiting installation of the power actuators.
- A design issue with the south ramp is being dealt with, with the hope to still get the ramp finished this month.

South Restrooms

• The two family restrooms are available for use. The diaper changing stations still need to be installed, and step stools for children to reach the sinks are on order.

Sanctuary

◆ A monitor for the balcony is in the works, and outlet box covers, some sound system wiring at the front, some touch up painting, carpet for the pulpit steps, and the like, still need finished.

Other areas:

- New internet cabling and equipment has been installed over the past two weeks.
- Elevator The work is on hold due to a tariff cost submitted by the elevator company. The architect firm and general contractor have been asked to deal with that extra expense. In addition, we learned that the elevator needs its own phone line, so that is in the works now, too.
- ◆ HVAC Final duct connections are being made in various rooms, and Richard Spiess is working with the subcontractor on heat settings and monitoring the system. The new boilers (there are two of them) are in the inspection process by the state. Screen fencing will be installed around the exterior air conditioning units at the carport and south porch.
- ♦ First Floor
 - Orywall finishing was completed, and painters were on site this past week to prime and paint those areas, and many others.

- The flooring crew installed the tile along the entire hallway, with entrance area carpet being installed as they have time, with cove base yet to be started. Flooring in the mothers room, narthex, parlor, and preschool room is yet to be finished.
- ♦ There is still ceiling grid work to do in the part-time staff office, parlor and preschool room.
- Second Floor Five rooms are in use, with the junior high youth room awaiting painting and flooring. The hallway carpet is being installed and the restroom tiling is complete.
- Being addressed: Parlor coffee bar, coat racks; storage units in custodian rooms, church office, preschool room, and the balcony; furniture needs; landscaping; paraments (altar, lectern and pulpit cloths); room signage; stained glass repair; security system; parlor window treatments; hallway décor; and a few other odds and ends.

- Congregational Meeting Results Here is information regarding the special congregational meeting held last Sunday, to deal with two contracts: a contract with Shepherd Staff and a contract with Rock Solid Landscape. The contract with Shepherd Staff, a church staffing organization, for the pastor search process, was approved, with an understanding that the search committee and the consistory will fiscally manage the contract cost. The contract with Rock Solid Landscape was approved, to remove and replace the lava rock with river rock, in all the landscaped beds around the church building, with a cost not to exceed \$33,000.
