SCRIPTURE READINGS

Isaiah 40:1-5 Comfort, comfort my people, says your God. ² Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and proclaim to her that her hard service has been completed, that her sin has been paid for, that she has received from the Lord's hand double for all her sins. ³ A voice of one calling: "In the desert prepare the way for the Lord; make straight in the wilderness a highway for our God. ⁴ Every valley shall be raised up, every mountain and hill made low; the rough ground shall become level, the rugged places a plain. ⁵ And the glory of the Lord will be revealed, and all mankind together will see it. For the mouth of the Lord has spoken."

Mark 1:1-8 The beginning of the gospel about Jesus Christ, the Son of God. ² It is written in Isaiah the prophet: "I will send my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way" -- ³ "a voice of one calling in the desert, 'Prepare the way for the Lord, make straight paths for him.'" ⁴ And so John came, baptizing in the desert region and preaching a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. ⁵ The whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem went out to him. Confessing their sins, they were baptized by him in the Jordan River. ⁶ John wore clothing made of camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. ⁷ And this was his message: "After me will come one more powerful than I, the thongs of whose sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie. ⁸ I baptize you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

P R E P A R E Season of Advent

Anyone who has hosted a Christmas dinner or party can tell you, there is a ton of preparation that goes into throwing these holiday celebrations. Many of us find ourselves doing lots of preparing in this busy season of lights, tinsel, and wrapping paper. Yet, what are we really preparing for? Who are we really preparing for? This Advent, hear God’s call: “Prepare!” – for the coming one, Jesus. Hear this imperative as an invitation to strip away all the fuss and ready your heart and life for the change that is coming when Jesus arrives.

“Advent is an invitation to stay awake as we wait for and recognize God’s in-breaking.”
(In-breaking – referring to the Second Coming of Christ, foretold to be a sudden, awesome arrival; while also referring to an awakening of faith in a person’s heart or in the church)

Last Sunday’s “missed” sermon... “Stay Awake” ~ Mark 13:24-37 (End of the Age)


Moments where God has been present in subtle or surprising ways

 - ◇ V. 35 ~ Therefore keep watch...”


Today’s Lesson – “Get Ready”

THE CHRISTMAS STORY SHARED FROM THE PERSPECTIVE OF A KEY STORY CHARACTER

Joseph's Reflection

When I first heard about the baby I was angry . . . angry at Mary for getting herself pregnant, angry at God for allowing it to happen, angry at myself for being tangled up in the mess of a pregnancy scandal. I couldn't give Mary away – it would be the end of her reputation and maybe even her life. But choosing silence implicated me in her pregnancy and the disgrace I would bring to my own good name was more than I could bear. I made up my mind to quietly divorce her. It was the only scenario I thought would give each of us any hope for the future. I would not openly accuse her, but I could not claim her child as mine.

Then one night an angel appeared to me in a dream. He told me not to be afraid to marry her – that Mary was in fact telling me the truth, and that her child was God's Child. Everything changed. I understood that God had chosen my fiancé to carry the Promised Messiah . . . and that He had chosen *me* to be His earthly father.

As we neared Mary's delivery, we were alone in a new city with no place to stay. I tried to be brave for Mary's sake, but I was lost in my own fear. I'd never delivered a baby before and I wanted so desperately for everything to be right. And then Jesus came into the world perfect and beautiful. It was the greatest moment of my life . . . possibly the greatest moment of all time . . . and the world *became* right.

I first met God's Son as a tiny helpless baby in the arms of my young wife . . . needing all the care and attention this finite and incapable dad could give to Him . . . yet He is my Savior. It is one of the many complexities I am sure to encounter over the course of my changed life. I have embraced this new story I've been given with everything I am. I know I'll never compare to His Father God, but I'm going to do my best to be the father He needs here on earth.

THE CHRISTMAS STORY SHARED FROM THE PERSPECTIVE OF A KEY STORY CHARACTER

Mary's Reflection

I knew you belonged to more than me. The angel told me you belonged to the world. The hope of humanity. No one understood how I could have a baby- I didn't have a husband. Joseph looked at me with pain in his eyes, until the angel appeared to him. But even then, my parents, my friends - they wanted to believe me, but such a fantastic tale. Those who loved me, even they were filled with wonder - but mostly doubt. And others just thought the worst. We'd all waited so long for the Messiah. We grew up hearing the prophecies that a king would come - and I was no princess. I was such an ordinary girl. Why would God choose me, and why would he do it this way? I knew, though, and Joseph knew. He realized what a gift we had been given and he was by my side throughout that long journey back to Bethlehem.

Weary and heavy with child, I couldn't wait for a place to lay my head. The world wasn't ready for you, though. Bethlehem certainly didn't open her arms to us. All the inns were full - people coming back to their birthplace. Perplexed and aching, we found our way into a cattle stall.

Joseph looked at me as if to say, "Did we imagine the angel? Would God allow his son to be born in such a humble place?" But through that long night in the stable, only Joseph was there. As I groaned in the agony of travail, lying on straw and looking up at the stars... Seeing that one star that reminded me you were not mine. The shepherds with their stories of angels were no surprise. I listened and my heart was glad like every other mother's heart hearing her child praised. I kept all these things and pondered them in my heart. The wise men would come later from distant lands. The magi, who had followed your star worshipped and gave you gifts. Gold - a gift for a king. Frankincense - denoting worship and reverence. And myrrh - what a strange gift. Bitterness, pain, suffering - what did these have to do with you?

The savior of the world. God tried to warn me that a sword would pierce my heart, but nothing could have prepared me for the future. My son, with just the hint of curl in his hair like mine - the one I thought the world wanted - executed as a criminal. The ways of God are past our knowing. Why did he choose me? A common girl, though from the royal line of David. Through all the pain that night and all the pain that would follow, far greater than the pain of labor, I could not see God's hand, and I thought at times he had forgotten us. You never faltered. Not in the wilderness, nor in the temple, not even on the way to the cross. It was only when I saw you risen that I could comprehend what it had all meant. All those things on that first night, looking into your innocent face. Had I known then what I know now, I would have still said yes - and you would have, too. Like the pain of birth, all sorrow is as nothing for the joy that it brings forth. We come with joy!

BUILDING PROJECT STATUS REPORT AS OF DECEMBER 4, 2025

Highlights and Info of the Work Week

- ◆ Entrance Doors – The carport door, two east doors and the south door – were all worked on this past week, with final trim pieces, electrical power, locking mechanisms and caulk finished. (the south door opener still needs power as of writing this...)
- ◆ All three drinking fountains are now working and ready for use, with a bottle filler available at the unit between the south family restrooms.
- ◆ The general contractor has worked out the tariff situation with the elevator company, so the final steps of testing and inspection are being scheduled.
- ◆ Completion of the elevator is awaiting a meeting of three companies to synchronize controls and operation.
- ◆ The HVAC system ductwork was tested this past week, with some minor corrections made. The heating systems and controls continue to be worked on, with finishing it all up this next week.
- ◆ First and Second Floor Rooms – Flooring is complete and ceiling grid is complete; with ceiling tiles to be installed and paint touched up as needed.
- ◆ Coat racks will be made in house, featuring rods for coat hangers and pegs for coat hooks.
- ◆ New signage throughout the building is in the works, identifying rooms by name and number.
- ◆ We are working with Habitec Security to upgrade the security system and to add electronic control of entrance door locking and unlocking, as well as a camera and phone extension at the south entrance. Their work will be scheduled for early January.
- ◆ Once the south accessible ramp is in place, the south entrance will be designated as the main entrance to the building Monday through Friday. All other doors will be kept locked so we gain awareness and oversight of who enters the building. There will be exceptions to this when we know an event is happening, such as the community meals and meetings in the Fireside Room.
- ◆ Sanctuary Paraments – The purple, white, red and green cloths that hang on the lectern, pulpit and above the altar (called dossal cloths) – Two of the dossal cloths were dry-cleaned and had sewing repairs done on them. It was determined that due to the condition and faded color of the cloths it was best to replace the paraments. Records of the company who provided the paraments back in the 1950's were found in the church files, so we have been working with Kanel Brothers on material, colors, sizes and costs. Kanel Brothers has started manufacturing the cloths and will send them to us as they are produced, with all paraments scheduled to be finished in late February.
- ◆ A walk-through of the project with two architects from Beilharz Architects took place this past week, documenting a list of items to be addressed by the contractors.
